# Gardening in Taihape

November brings the hint of summer conditions in the garden whilst still clinging to some cooler mornings. Growth is rapid and plants must be kept well watered to maintain and sustain this growth. It may seem funny to be watering after such copious amounts of rain but our gardens can dry out very rapidly and it is important to water and maintain a good level of moisture before wilting sets in.

Mulching will help in this department by retaining soil moisture over the coming summer months a good base peat, bark or

compost to a depth of around 3-5cm will help drastically personal I apply mulch very thick and therefore also only reapply every other year because of this.

In terms of flowers, trim back any shoots from our roses that have already flowered, I know there will be some early ones out there and a good helping of spray to keep small insects at bay. Gladiolus, Canna Lilies and

Chrysanthemum will be ideal for planting this month.

In the vegetable department, our vegetables will be experiencing the same style growth as their flowering companions. Remember to maintain a good level of moisture here as well in order for our crops to grow to their fullest and **also a layer of mulch wouldn't go a miss of some of the** delicate items, although choosing the right mulch for vegetables is key here, a more organic approach should be viewed in order to stay clear of any potential chemical releases from treated mulch or bark.

Hint: when it comes to spraying for aphids on roses and other delicates mix one teaspoon of garlic powder to one litre of water and spray evenly. A little organic tip used in the Buckingham Palace gardens.

#### Taihape Community Board Comments

I am so pleased to be able to begin these Community Board comments on a positive note as we are now able to report that two major projects have been completed. The Dog Park is now finished, fully fenced and safe for local and visiting canines. Completing the park has been a rather drawn out task as the land is leasehold and, as many of you will remember, was the site of a number of houses for railway staff hence we had to have various approvals and clearances before fencing could commence.

Even during the fencing new requirements kept 'popping up'! However the project is now complete and officially opened. I do not usually mention names in this column but I must acknowledge our contractor, Mr Bill Nelson for, not only his skill but his ideas and tolerance—a great job, thanks Bill.

The Board also acknowledges the generosity of Mr Don Tweeddale for the donation of the gate for vehicle access and our Board member Gail Larsen for the pedestrian gate. Incidentally Gail and the well-mannered Nelson (a fine Rottweiler) had the privilege of cutting the ribbon.

The second major project completed is placement of two defibrillators (AED's) to provide further twenty-four hour coverage for the public. One AED is now placed outside the front entrance of New World supermarket with the other on an outer wall of the Swimming Baths. The latter will provide coverage for the public and the sporting codes.

However we still have many projects to complete but we have moved ahead with several --Board members have decided on the location of an extra seat in the Cemetery - we just need the approval of Council staff and the seat in Kaka Road is a replacement for the one that "disappeared"! Work continues on the Events Boards, Information Boards and signage within the town while Disability Parking, the future of the Tui Street building and the condition and location of security cameras continue to be put before Council.

A reminder to all - Council is currently working on the Long Term Plan, the publication of a draft copy sees the commencement of a period of consultation followed by submissions from the public. Do have your say. The Mayor and council staff will be at a "Talking Table" on 29 Nov—the Xmas Parade.

Finally, a big thankyou to the many groups who are working so hard for the betterment of our community and I must add that the old Cascade Brewery Building looks really smart.
