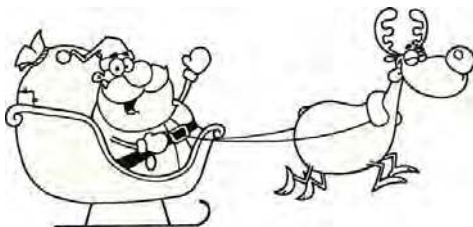

Papakai Park Developments

Residents have been horrified to see the mess made due to recent work at Papakai Park. Rangitikei District Council (RDC), has been working under urgency to protect the Awa by stopping any further leaks of sewerage into the Hautapu River. As a first step Manawatu District Council, (shared services), have been in charge of the installation of the tanks to contain any overflow of the sewerage system. Sadly, this has meant significant earthworks and the beautification of the park, that was completed last year by local volunteers, has been seriously impacted on. Taihape Crs have been assured that these tanks are temporary measures, that the grassed area will be reinstated and the permanent new pump station will mean the tanks can be removed again. This complicated mitigation was necessary because of the urgency to protect the Hautapu.

Newly appointed Taihape Community Development Trust Project/Events Co-ordinator Pania Winia ta has returned home and relishing the new challenge of working directly for the community, with the community and especially in the community.

Pania says both her and her partner have kept themselves busy working within the local district, where she spent seven years working at the Waiouru Military Camp. GARDENING IN TAIHAPE



During these water Spring days everything in the garden will start to flourish. Shrubs will spring into life with new growth from their winter dormancy.

That's all well and good but have you tried water gardening?

Water lilies and other exotics have always fascinated me and can be grown in the smallest of means it's not necessary to have a pond. A vast variety of glazed pots or pots that can hold water will do just fine.

You can experiment with many varieties and colours right through to more exotics like lotus lilies more commonly associated with the tropics. Having grown these in pots it's also a good way to protect more special varieties from the winter months by moving to a more sheltered environment, something you won't get with an open pond.

In terms of keeping the water clean, water lilies should help do the trick also, they're by covering the surface of the water to reduce the amount of sunlight on the water therefore reducing the growth of algae blooms.

In the rest of the garden, most warm season vegetables can be grown towards the end of the month and now is the perfect opportunity to work and prepare the soil, but don't forget your lawns as well. We will see increased growth in the lawn department to regular fertilising and trimming will keep your yard looking fantastic

FROM THE Mayor's Desk

There have been a number of questions raised within the Taihape community over the last few weeks and that I accept our communication could have been better.



Council staff had some time ago thought that they had solved the problems of waste water (sewage) discharge to the Hautapu River. This proved not to be the case with subsequent discharges. Council had to act under urgency, both from an environmental position and a risk position, with regard to Horizons. Four new containment tanks were put in to collect any possible discharge and pumping from them continued at times of high rainfall to prevent any discharge to the river. So what is planned for the future? A new pumping station is being designed and built with a generator in case of power shutdown. When that process is complete I have been advised that at least three of the tanks will be removed. The mess left by the urgent worksite will be cleaned up. I have a huge respect for the group involved with the Papakai Park and their plans for the walkway and bridges linking to Memorial Park and will do all I can to assist them. Council, on their behalf, have applied to the PGF (Minister Jones' fund) for financial help to assist with this project and Council will be a willing partner. My apologies, we should have put onto our website the work envisaged with the reasons for it earlier than we have done so.

I have also had enquiries around the demolition of the burnt out buildings in Taihape and "when will they be demolished?". Council is working with Kiwirail around the monitoring of the asbestos and the consent process. As I understand it, no levels of asbestos have been detected in the air. Unfortunately because of

the proximity to rail this process could take some time.

I understand the differing views of the community regarding the amenity block build on Memorial Park. I had hoped that a report would be available to Council regarding the options for building under the grandstand or as a standalone project at the next Council Meeting. Staff are working on the project with urgency but it may not be available as early as I had hoped. I would however rather have an accurate report than one that is incomplete leading to a poor decision.

I am concerned about the possibility of a drought next summer, with river levels and ground moisture indicating a severe deficit. Hopefully recent rain in the next couple of months will prevent this. But anything we can do to limit water loss either on farms or in our towns should be looked at.

The Long Term Plan work is our major focus and Ward Councillors and myself need to know as early as possible what major works could be planned for over the next few years in Taihape.

Framing our future

Council is carrying out a pre-engagement process to determine topics to be consulted on during the Draft 2021-31 Long Term Plan Consultation next year. Pre-engagement is a new approach for Council and is designed to make it easier for everyone to have a voice. Framing Our Future pre-engagement will run through until the end of November. We'll be at the Hunterville Huntaway Festival 31 October and at most communities events across the district in the next few months – let us know if you have a community day planned and we'll do our best to be there. 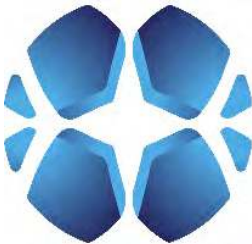

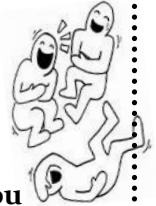

Control of Dogs Bylaw Amendment

Council is proposing an amendment to the Control of Dogs Bylaw allowing for a maximum of two dogs in residential areas with any further requiring a multi-dog permit.

The proposed fee for a multi dog permit is \$30.00 which would need to be applied for every three years. If the proposed amendment was formally adopted the fee would not come in to place until 1 July 2021.

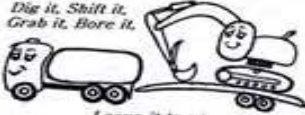
