



Gardening in Taihape

April brings some much needed showers to our gardens this month and replenishes the moisture levels for both flora and fauna, as particularly seen in my own garden with the freshness of flowering roses and hydrangeas over the last week.

However this also means weeds as well, which too will need tending too throughout out shrubberies and borders. Pay attention to these flower beds as one rids them of unwanted summer debris and weeds, and utilise the freshly tended too earth to plant out new bulbs ready for spring.

In the vegetable department particularly in the cooler climates of the central north island we may be autumn harvesting. Broccoli, cabbage and cauliflower will be ripe for the picking and also spinach as well as replanting or sowing for successive harvesting. This will go well alongside one's eggs benedict on a Sunday morning.

Along with harvesting for the winter months ahead make sure that you regularly check produce once you have stored it. Check for signs of decay with any fruit species and pumpkins. This will help keep the stores full until needed.

Again topdressing our lawns will help with the recovery of damaged patches, burns and general dead spots that your lawn may have suffered through the dry spell. A good balanced fertiliser will give the lawn a much needed health boost to ensure a much deeper colour and prompt fine lush grass whilst discouraging more undesirable coarse species.


