Tena koe, Three Waters remains at the forefront of my mind, we need to engage as widely as possible with the district on the options.

I will be asking Council to consider a letter drop to all residents outlining the Three Waters position, the advantages and disadvantages for the Rangitikei District Council to either opt out of the aggregated model or remain in. The difficulty for us is that we are still waiting on further information from Central Government. The Government has released their decision. on where the boundaries for the four national waters entities will lie.

Rangitikei is placed in Entity B along with 22 other Councils. This region includes everything north of us and to the south of Auckland including Taranaki, Notably this area does not include



Wellington, Palmerston North or Manawatū as I had previously anticipated. The Three Waters decision Council makes in October will undoubtedly be the biggest decision we have ever made and probably the biggest in Local Government since the 1989 amalgamations.



Gardening in Taihape

August is usually a temperamental month with varying weather changes but it is also the month that ushers in some new garden activity. It's a time for us to establish new spring gardens from veggies to flowers and fruit. We should start seeing vast growth on our spring bulbs pushing from the undergrowth and new buds appearing on a variety of species, more prominent on fruit and roses.

In the flower department, our bulbs will be showing signs of spring, you should take care and pay particular attention to base weeds and keep these areas clear. Carefully cultivating and wedding will allow for a full show when flowering comes to fruition. Prepare other beds also in a similar manner to maintain appearances and lessen the workload through the growing season, little and often in the weeding department can be a saviour.

When it comes to fruit and veg, this month can be a good opportunity to get seeds sown in trays for transplanting later in the year, and where soil conditions are slightly boggy and cold a layer of pea straw, peat or compost will make planting later on easier. Our fruiting trees will also be in need of some attention. Fertilise at the base by spreading evenly around the drip line making sure you keep clear of the trunk and water if applicable and citrus will be reaching maturity.

All in all we will be heading for a great growing season and a 'little but often' will work wonders in your garden.

Advice for RSV and other winter respiratory illnesses

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), the contagious illness which affects young children, is affecting whānau all over New Zealand, but simple hygiene such as keeping children at home and washing hands can help stop the virus from spreading.

Dr Ian Murphy, WDHB's Chief Medical Officer, says adults with RSV have symptoms similar to the common cold and will mostly be able to recover at home, but babies and very young children can become very unwell quickly. Older adults or people with compromised immune systems, or those with heart or lung conditions may also be more at risk from RSV.

RSV is not a new virus and is common during the winter.

"If your child has symptoms of RSV – a runny nose, cough, vomiting or fever - we encourage you to ring Healthline on 0800 611 116 or talk to your GP in the first instance. However, if their symptoms are getting worse, or they stop eating or drinking, or find it hard to breathe, bring them to Whanganui Hospital's emergency department," says Dr Murphy.

The emergency department is being supported by the DHB's paediatricians during the RSV outbreak to ensure more timely attention is given to young children presenting to the emergency department and Whanganui Accident & Medical Clinic with respiratory related issues.

"In severe cases of RSV, or other respiratory illness, some children and older adults may be admitted to hospital, but in many cases children and whānau will be given information about how to cope with respiratory illness at home," says Dr Murphy.

"We all know the rules about infection prevention since we've lived through the COVID-19 pandemic and these rules equally apply to any other contagious diseases, such as RSV. Wash your hands, cough and sneeze into your elbow, don't share drinking glasses and stay at home if you are sick. Please keep your child away from day-care or school if they are sick."

We ask that visitors are kept to a minimum in the children's ward and that healthy children do not visit the hospital due to the infectious nature of the illness. All people who are unwell with flu-like symptoms are asked not to visit the hospital other than for emergency care.
