Taihape and Wellbeing Development December 2021 Update

Collaborative Media Release agreed by; Tracey Hiroa, GM Mokai Patea Services Marian Cleaver, Chair Otaihape Health Trust Jude MacDonald, CE Whanganui Regional Health Network

It has been another busy month for all of the partners as we progress work streams associated to the Taihape development and moving the THL primary care workforce and Mokai Patea Whānau Ora service (as the core providers) back into the Rural Health Centre. The Taihape Development governance group met and along with a Manager from Rangitikei Council, moved several streams of work forward and this will be the focus of this newsletter update.

Jaime Reibel, Rangitikei District Council Strategic Advisor, Economic Development, has been leading a council-led approach of talking with the Taihape community to gauge interest in progressing the possibility of establishing an Abbyfield model group home which would offer shared accommodation, with staff support, for independent, mobile seniors and the elderly.. This would be an option proposed to utilise the current THL facility owned by Otaihape Health Trust. As the community trust will be the lessor of the entire DHB Hospital campus, Marian Cleaver reinforced that "it would be ideal to have all of the facilities occupied and providing key services for the community to keep people well." Anyone interested in being part of a volunteer coordination committee are asked to contact Jaime at the Rangitikei District Council office.

Whanganui District Health Board have agreed to remove two "eye- sores" on the campus before 1 July 2022. The old Domestic Services building, and Dr Edi's old General Practice facility will be either removed or demolished. This decision has met with a great deal of positive comments from the community and will enable the Trust to consider how they utilise that land. Marian Cleaver continues to have conversations with St John Ambulance with the shared desire to have them on site to support the collaborative model of services working together to achieve positive outcomes for the community. The DHB are also looking at another option to fuel the boiler so we are not using coal into the future, and how and where we could locate the new X-Ray machine they plan to purchase Taihape in 2022 so the service is integrated with other primary care services in the RHC.

Marian is keen to see some greater connectivity with Community Trust groups that are established to support the community. She is keen to ensure that a collective approach is taken as developments unfold. Please contact Marian directly.

Tracey Hiroa, GM Mokai Patea Services, reinforced that "through all of us working together we will get the best outcomes for the community, and this will future proof our services into the future." A couple of collaborative meetings have been held to bring the primary care team and Whanau Ora team together to discuss how they will work differently for the future. It is very apparent that the teams have confidence in each other and that the opportunity this facility design offers is to reassess how they work and to ensure the people they are caring for do not have to repeat their story over and over and get access to more connected care.

Duncan Sinclair has been contracted by Whanganui Regional Health Network as the Architect to assess the facility and to figure out how we will all fit in and what workspaces

will be shared or used flexibly. He has visited the site a couple of times and had casual conversations with some of the leaders and team members and community. He is impressed with the potential the facility has and in what good condition it is in. He is clear that while we must work with an existing footprint, that he can create a centre that has visual impact on entering the door, is welcoming, functional and caters for needs beyond health so that it contributes to community cohesiveness and belonging and wellness.

We have heard from community members about how this development is putting right the wrongs of the past, and how relieved they are that this good building will finally be in use again. People talked about their desire for social spaces including a place that our youth might wish to use and access and perhaps even extending to after school job opportunities. Midwifery service was discussed as a critical service and the role it provides in supporting our emerging next generation. The community have talked about wanting to see a merged model with "no door the wrong door".

The Architect believes the process to completion will take eighteen months from now. This is partly due to issues in getting contractors / undertaking work in a COVID environment and all the streams of work that will be required to bring the facility up to today's expected standards. THL / WRHN are keen for cost to be kept to within \$2 million which will be funded by Taihape Health Limited. WDHB will continue to take care of the maintenance of the RHC and that cost will be passed on in the lease agreement. Additional funding will need to be found for equipment and design bits and Mokai Patea Services will fund the cost of their renovations.

The team associated with the Taihape Development take this opportunity to wish you all a very safe and healthy Xmas period. Be sure to take your covid passports with you, scan in, wash your hands and wear a mask!

s my children would say "there's only Aabout 20 big sleeps to Xmas." It is the time that we reflect on the year that has been and what a tough year it was.

The Covid pandemic has caused all sorts of things, some people have lost their jobs, businesses have been put on hold or in a couple of cases lost, work programs have suffered, and I fear that the worst is yet to come. The Rangittkei with the Whanganui DHB region has had a wakeup call with being declared in the red traffic light zone. This call was made by Government. because of our low vaccination rates, the solution is in our hands-get vaccinated, scan in and carry your vaccination passport. There are several project milestones to update this month. We are in the final stages of awarding a build contract for the new Amenities Block in Taihape. This has been a project years in the making and it's great to see construction nearly ready to start.

Council also spent time discussing the various options for strengthening the Grandstand and are now looking to do a high level costing evaluation. Council is committed to progressing this work early in the new year. This is likely to involve a steel reinforcing structure within and I do note that the building already has a form of steel framework within it. It involves a whole lot

of the tidy-up work associated with bringing the building up to spec such as painting and redoing stairways etc, reroofing and upgrading power and fire protection.



The Mangaweka Bridge replacement construction is near completion and we are expecting the project to be finished in July next year. The good news is that we are on target for dates and operating within budget. There is still work needing to be done around how the old bridge is to be managed as part of the retention.

Each year Beth and I help sponsor the Xmas lunches in Taihape and Marton, attending them alternately on Xmas day. With the restrictions of Covid Lunderstand that this will not happen this year. Instead, we will support the foodbanks. It is a pity that the lunch will not happen because there are those in our communities that look forward to being able to celebrate Xmas with others.

The new year will see projects long in the making. being built which is exciting. Finally, we will see new facilities on the park becoming a reality. I would also like to acknowledge the work that is and has been done by the Papakai Park group. Hook forward to being able to support Charity Davis and her work with the playground update. It has been a tough year, enjoy Christmas with your families and please travel safely.

Gardening in Taihape

We will now be in the full swing of summer and our garden bursting with life and colour

Our vegetable gardens should be or thereabouts brimming with the fruits of hours or care and attention just ripe for the picking.

Over the next few months as the warmer season dries everything out we need to pay particular attention to watering. In some cases where water via hose or sprinkler is not an option careful consideration should be placed on specific watering of plants either special, vulnerable to drought or juvenile. I find that newly planted trees may require a few litres every other day via bucket just to keep them from drying out. If we have mulched through the winter then we are already ahead of the game as this will help retain moisture levels.

In our vegetable gardens, we are entering into a time of harvest for those summer crops but this doesn't come without its drawbacks. Watering, spraying and weeding will all be needed through that warmer season to keep everything in tip top condition.

Our flower gardens will be the same. Watering, spraying and weeding will come to the forefront during these warmer months and pay particular attention to those more tender species to get them through summer. If your garden beds are heavily mulched or underplanted with thick ground covers then moisture retention will be higher than garden beds with exposed surfaces. One plant in particular I have found to provide not only great structure but is also a fantastic ground cover is Phlomis russeliana or Jerusalem Sage although rather common its popularity is coming back around. I find giving it a cut back once or twice a year keeps it in peak form for its summer flowering.
