FROM THE Mayor'S Desk

I'd like to thank Taihape for the huge number of submissions into the Long Term Plan and thank those who attended the many Long Term Plan meetings we held throughout the district.



I was thrilled that at the Long Term Plan deliberations Council has agreed to support a number of work programmes in Taihape such as the \$50,000 going to the playground group led by Charity, and an undertaking to progress the Grandstand restoration.

Probably my biggest concern around the Long

Term Plan is a decision that Council has been forced into making by Waka Kotahi (the old NZTA or Roading Authority) to cut effectively \$7m from our roading programs over the next three years. This is a concern that I am taking to Central Government. With the cutback in maintenance of our roading network, in the future we could see roads that are currently sealed reverting back to a metal base. I will fight this action every step of the way with Central Government.

This isn't particular to our network - it affects all rural Councils and even affects the maintenance on the state highway networks.

My thanks also go to the number of sports groups working on the final designs for the Taihape Amenities Block. Let's just get on and actually build something rather than talk about it! Nga mihi, Mayor Andy Watson, Rangitikei District Council.

Adolescents and Gut function

This is another article on research that indicates the importance of a healthy gut, healthy diet and lifestyle.

"ADOLESCENT GUT MICROBIOME Gut microbiota depletion in adolescence can have lasting neurobehavioral effects, according to a recent study assessing the long-term effects of gut microbiota depletion in adolescent mice.

The study investigated the effects of microbiota depletion of adolescent mice using a 3-week antibiotic treatment. Researchers observed changes in gut microbiota, behavioural and molecular features of gut-brain communication of the mice from adolescence into adulthood.

Findings included:

- Transient microbiota depletion had longlasting effects on microbiota composition and increased anxiety-like behaviour in mice exposed to antibiotic treatment during adolescence but not in adulthood
- Gene expression in the amygdala was more severely affected in mice treated during adolescence

These results indicate the vulnerability of the gut microbiota during the critical adolescent period and the long-lasting impact of alterations of the microbiota on gene expression and behaviour in adulthood. The mechanisms leading to neurobehavioral effects are thought to be due to disruption of gut microbial communities (via antibiotics in this study) affecting gut-brain communication which ultimately can manifest as changes in brain function and behaviour.

Overall, this study highlights vulnerability of the gut microbiota during the adolescent period and the importance of the microbiota during the developmental period in shaping its host's microbiota, brain function and behaviour

This review highlights the susceptibility of the microbiome to be affected in adolescence, with gene expression and behavioural impacts in adulthood. A holistic treatment consisting of diet and lifestyle interventions are some of the best ways to improve gut microbiome health in adolescents." Reference: available

Gardening in Taihape

Now that the snows are upon us we can truly say winter has arrived. Every month gives us a unique perspective into the gardening world. Our views can change dramatically with temperature as we well know. Leading on in the structural aspect of gardening we should all be laying a framework through the cooler months for the establishment of your garden's future.

This month we are going to talk about lighting. I have recently invested in a good quality set of outdoor waterproof lights. These are especially handy for the tricky to light areas and if your home is equipped with outdoor plugs then they will simply plug in and illuminate those spots.

Upright lighting can illuminate tree trunks and expose your visual sensors to the wonders of your trees at night and well as down lighting illuminating meandering paths. Like laying out the format of a garden bed, lights can induce a sense of fullness through the night and bring to life your garden 24 hours a day. Illuminate water heaters to focus water movement, highlight a feature rock for structural stability and as stated, illuminate meandering paths to create a sense of journey.

It is important to think about the quality of lights you are installing also. Low voltage lighting is more practical for the garden and safer to lay DIY. Low heat output also reduces the risk of scorching plant foliage. Another option for those tricky areas and where power cannot be supplied are the use of candles and lanterns. These can be relatively low cost and give off a similar effect especially for those upcoming evening outdoor fiestas.

I look forward to spotting illuminated gardens in the coming months

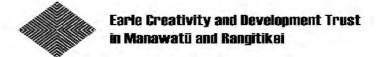

Dry July - a chance to kick alcohol and help charity

30 June 2021

Dry July should be a little easier this year with the help of a few of the lads from Whanganui District Health Board.

They've put together a video series featuring their inspiration for going dry, tips for the month and some of the benefits they find from taking a month off alcohol.

The videos, featuring Whanganui DHB health promoters Chester Penaflor and Sam Beatson-Shaw and Alcohol & Other Drugs Clinician Shane Brown will be shared on social media throughout the month of July.

Chester says this is his fifth year doing Dry July and he's using it as an opportunity to raise awareness about Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) and the importance of alcohol-free pregnancies.

His tips for the month include letting friends and family know he's doing Dry July, having routines to deal with boredom and planning ahead if attending events where alcohol is being consumed.

"In case there's gatherings such as friends' birthdays, have a plan for how you'll stay alcohol free and still have a good time."

Chester says he finds huge personal benefit from doing Dry July.

In my case, the benefits are probably more mental and spiritual rather than physical.

"After the month of July, I feel confident that I still have the coping strategies to stay off alcohol.

"It also gives me a sense of self-efficacy, meaning change is possible. It gravitates towards my actions in the community and with individuals alike."

Since Dry July launched in Aotearoa in 2012, the campaign has inspired 37,000 Kiwis to go dry, raising \$5.1 million for people affected by cancer, and funding more than 170 projects for 15 beneficiary organisations across the country.

This year funds raised by participants of Dry July will help Look Good Feel Better NZ, Bowel Cancer NZ, PINC & STEEL NZ and the Prostate Cancer Foundation of New Zealand improve the comfort, care and wellbeing of people affected by cancer.

That's something not to drink to!

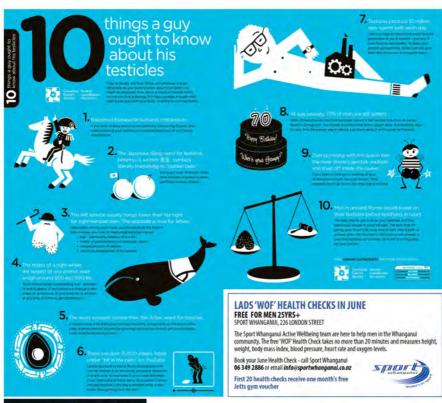

WHY DO GUYS SHUN THE DOCTOR BUT WOMEN DON'T?

Lets face it, us men are really bad patients. Compared with women, we avoid going to the doctor, skip more recommended screenings and practice risker behaviour. Furnily enough, we also die about four or five years sooner, liew with more years of bad health and have higher suide rates.

It isn't because we're tough or less susceptible to illness. It's because we're idiots. Instead of embracing the power of knowledge and early detection, we stubbornly resist information and treatment for the short-term gain of autonomy and comenience.

We guys want to drink, play sports, and eat what we want, whenever we want, just like we did we were twenty. We avoid the doctor to avoid being told what we don't want to hear. When our girlfriends or wives ask about our health, we often lie. We withhold information.

We do the same with doctors. When a doctor asks, "Any specific issues to address?" too many of us say, "No, I feel great," even when we don't. Men can be stubborn, know-it-alls, and mansplainers.

Asking for help isn't a sign of weakness but rather it is a sign of strength.

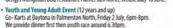
