The community came together on the 7<sup>th</sup> August 2021 at the Hautapu River Park's, (HRP), Redwoods entrance to plant 2,000 New Zealand native trees to: "Commemorating Early Leadership in The Inland Patea History".

Specifically, the planting celebrates Tamakōpiri, descended from Tamatea Pokai Whenua and his wife Taanewhare, a founding story for the people of the Inland Mokai Patea. Representatives of Ngāti Tamakopiri, Friends of Taihape and around 70 supporters, joined forces to enhance and beautify Taihape's Hautapu River Park.

The trees were funded by MPI, who also contributed funding towards the lunch along with Mokai Patea Services' filled roles and slices and woman-power, and Rangitikei District Council who took the opportunity to consult on the name of the new Amenities building on Memorial Park and fired up their BBQ to cook sausages donated by Mayor Andy. With the weather a bit 'iffy' it was great to have a gazebo and the Gumboot signs, by local artists, from the Taihape Community Development Trust as well. Thank you everyone, and for coming along! Council is working with local food pantries and MSD regarding local food supply. If you have already tried other avenues for support with food supply, such as family / whanau and MSD, and your needs are still not met, please contact our Customer Experience Team on 0800 422 522. Once we have your details, a member of our Civil Defence response team will be in contact to assist.

With spring upon us comes growth in our outdoor areas such as parks and cemeteries. You will soon see our teams return to lawnmowing and weed trimming at Level 3 with the appropriate health



and safety protocols in place. Plans are being put in place at the moment to catch up once we can return to business as usual. We will monitor the situation and if we feel the spring growth is becoming uncontrollable we will look at alternative work procedures to restart mowing. Please be patient with us on this.

#### NEWS UPDATE TAIHAPE HOSPITAL CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT

Three organisations have come together to drive positive change for the community in how and where you access health and social services in Taihape.

Board members of Otaihape Health Trust (HT), the owner of the facility that is currently occupied by Taihape Health Limited (the primary care service), have joined the leaders from Mokai Patea Services (MPS) and Whanganui Regional Health Network (WRHN) to negotiate with the Whanganui District Health Board (WDHB) to be the lessor (or landlord) for the entire Hospital Road health campus which includes the Rural Health Centre (old Hospital) the old General practice (previously occupied by Dr Edi ) and the other various old buildings on the campus. "This is a wonderful opportunity for the Taihape community to oversee a large asset which has so much potential to develop into a "One Stop Shop" for health and wellness for our rural community" says Marian Cleaver, Chair of OTHT.

Health Trust has been the landlord for Taihape Health Itd (THL) which is owned by WRHN since the liquidation of the community trust over ten years ago. The relationship between both parties has been high trust and THL have been reliable tenants. This change will secure the facility for the community for future generations and offers the potential to revitalise the Rural Health Centre. It is hoped the RHC facility will be maximised by permanent and casual tenants and by interested parties, to ensure the venture is low risk for the Community Trust Directors who have ultimate accountability for the financial viability.

OTHT Health Trust board members who are leading and working alongside the partners are;

Marian Cleaver, Chair Les Rowlands Mary Freeman Karen Randall Michael Andrews

Mokai Patea Services board have agreed for their operational leader Tracey Hiroa to investigate co-locating their Whānau Ora Service team alongside Taihape Health Services within the RHC. Tracey has reiterated many times that "while this is not cost neutral for MPS services (as they own their own facility in Hautapu Street), this is the right thing to do for now and into the future".

The critical factor for success is that this re-location is affordable for all the tenants as well as cover costs of maintaining the grounds and buildings. An early meeting with a representative from WDHB has been favourable with WDHB acknowledging that the facility has complex systems due to it being a hospital, so WDHB has agreed it will continue to maintain the facility and this cost will be off charged to tenants.

Both the boards' of WRHN and THL (their subsidiary company), have delegated Jude MacDonald CE WRHN to lead this development on their behalf. THL Directors have been operating out of two facilities for many years, however "the desire to have all our services under one roof has been an aspiration for a very long time", says Dr Ken Young, Chair of WRHN and a Director THL. The Directors have explored extending their existing facility with HT landlord, however, following COVID 19 in 2020 it was clear that the facility is too tight for the way we must operate in the future.

The cost for the internal refurbishment required to accommodate the general practice at the RHC will be met by WRHN / RHL and while essential to the design is to have an effective general practice model, "we are aware that the cost of moving walls etc will not be cheap. It is intended for an architect to be recruited so we have an expert to guide us through the possibilities this big footprint offers us", said Jude MacDonald. MPS will meet the cost of any refurbishment needed for their service. The Health Trust would be responsible for refurbishing shared spaces that would be tenanted out or rented for casual users so as much of the space is utilised and returning an income as possible.

#### Next steps are;

- 1. Negotiate a fair and reasonable lease between OTHT and WDHB
- Confirm partners that may wish to support this collaborative approach through tenanting space and or land
- 3. WTHN / THL and MPS Work with an Architect to help design efficient spaces that can meet the needs of general practice and Whānau ora services operating in a collaborative model

#### **Community Comments September**

The Community Board was not able to meet as scheduled on the 18<sup>th</sup> of August due to 'lockdown' but never-the-less I will keep you informed as to recent and planned activities of your board.

On behalf of the Board Gail and I met with Murray Phillips (RDC Head of Parks and Reserves) on two occasions, the first being a "get to know you and where are we at" type of meeting and the second meet followed by a tour of the town with Keep Taihape Beautiful and Rotary to discuss issues of concern and future plans. Murray has since reported that concerns mentioned have been, or are being, addressed. Most centred on the general tidiness of footpaths and gardens together with concrete pads for the picnic tables at Quickstop corner and the base of the Gumboot statue.

The upgrade of the Outback area is in the planning process. Signage informing folk, in particular travellers, of the location of the Dog Park is in place and we have a choice of designs to look at from RDC regarding dogs on Memorial Park.

The Community Board, Community Development Trust and Keep Taihape Beautiful have met again to keep our respective organisations informed. After all we are all working to promote the town and wider community. Congratulations to the Hautapu River Park Collectives for a very successful Commemorative Planting in spite of a miserable day weather-wise. TCB have donated a seat to the park and will supply an appropriate plaque.

I have canvassed a number of businesses as to ideas to enhance our main street. We are fortunate that many shops present very attractive street frontages.

In closing I must acknowledge the swiftness of the response of the Taihape Community Response Group. It is reassuring to know that we have a great group of volunteers for support in times of need.

#### Gardening in Taihape

The sun is shining and we have been propelled into spring which will be welcomed by gardeners all over.

This can mean a hectic time in the garden for those with green thumbs as a never ending list of jobs will not be creeping up. Spring shows us the fruits of our labour during those cold dormant months here in Taihape. Fresh buds and shoots spring forth.

In the flower department we will see new growth on a range of flowering crops. Roses being the most dominant at this stage. It is important to maintain their health right from the get go and this will bring them into fruition right up until the seasons end. Spray fertilise regularly to maintain optimum health.

With our fruits and veggies, we can see that often young shoots and new growth can be attacked by downy mildew and other nasties which will prevent a good growing season and often leave the leaves in a poor state of health. This is also seen across our fruiting specimens and drug this time we can often be dealt with the spreading of fungal infections leaving leaves and foliage deformed. A topical spray with a copper base should suffice in these areas and give a good amount of protection. However I think the best defence is to spray early before the onset of such issues.

We have taken a well deserved break from all that lawn mowing but that too will be in need of some attention.

I find a weed and feed will provide optimum growth as well as remove those unwanted weeds that tend to invade. Sowing a new lawn through spring is a good chance to get established before the dryer months ahead and where possible water well to give your property the edge when it comes to having a lush green lawn.
