Group Home Survey Receives Strong Response

The group home survey in last month's issue of Talk Up Taihape, to determine the level of interest in the community for a purpose-built facility in Taihape for mobile seniors and the elderly, has received a solid response.

The group home survey received eighteen submissions over a four week period and closed on Thursday, April 7th. It was jointly sponsored by the Taihape Housing Steering Group and the Taihape Community Development Trust, with many thanks due to Taihape Older & Bolder, the Taihape Friendship Group and the Taihape Women's Club for publicising it with their members.

Survey results will be analysed by the end of April and will be communicated to the community in the next issue of the Talk Up Taihape.

Taihape Housing Steering Group - Update

The Taihape Housing Steering Group continues to focus on social housing locally, as well as additional pensioner housing, and increasing the availability of affordable housing in the town.

The Rangitikei District Council are now indicating an appetite to help achieve our objectives, sounds promising.

To achieve our objectives, the group has been actively looking to identify suitable land for subdivision and have recently met with a number of national community housing groups. We will also be working with Kainga Ora over the next few weeks to progress an increase in available rental housing.

FROM THE Mayor'S DESK

here is a lot currently happening!

Council has prepared our draft Annual Plan and next week we are sending out a flyer detailing the Annual Plan and rates increase, which includes an expected rating increase of 7.29%. We know that not everyone gets the District Monitor delivered so we are using a combination of ways to get the information out. Please have your say before the close-off date of Monday 9 May. If you have questions please either contact me on 027 617 7668, or a Councillor or staff. We will also have drop-in sessions, if Covid allows, and will be using social media to engage as well.

I want to reassure people that the business case analysis is being done to look at the future of the Taihape Town Hall, whether it is to be replaced, strengthened or a combination of the two. That business case, when developed, will be a public discussion document.

The Spatial Plan, Pae Tawhiti Rangitikei Beyond, work continues. Thank you for those who have attended a drop-in session already. This is a chance for you to have a say on the future of Taihape. Details of what the spatial plan is and how to have your say are available on the Council website.

The Government's position to establish the four new water entities is unchanged and is being out into law - we will have no say. Our Council position is that we don't like the way it is being done and we continue to argue for changes to the legislation. I have been asked to co-Chair a working party of DIA (Department of Internal Affairs) looking at the policy positions around these changes.



This is, in my view, the best chance to have our say and to get changes. Some people have questioned this role and have asked if it is a paid role and whether I am working for the Government. The answer is absolutely not, it is an unpaid role and this is a chance, as I've said, to look for change. Because of the high interest and lack of information from Government I will have public meetings in Marton, Bulls and Taihape explaining the Three Waters and the impact on the Rangitikei and what we are doing about it and what future avenues may be possible. These public meetings will be notified through the District Monitor and our website next week, and of course I am happy to come and talk to any person or community group separately at any time.

Last week we issued a conservation of water notice to Taihape as a result of heavy rain events, and I thank you for lowering demand and am happy to say that we are now back under control.

Plaques have been printed and are in place on the seats at both Hautapu River Park and Kaka Rd.

I have been in discussion with the Development Trust as there are projects that we can work on together to enhance our community—the painted yellow gumboot heritage trail, extra seating and others.

As a community we are very fortunate to have numerous support services working together so efficiently at this uncertain time with a special "reach out" to our health workers Thankyou all. Nga mihi nui.





Gardening in Taihape

April ushers in cooler mornings and nights along with some much needed moisture. The lawns and garden beds showing signs of rejuvenation with flushes of new green growth.

Our flower beds will be needing tending to and in much need of some tidying up with the last of our summer annuals needing removal and flowering perennials needing a trim. However sparse this may seem never feel there are plenty of alternatives to go in their place. It's a good time for replanting and seed sowing. Ranunculus and anemones could be a welcomed addition and preparation for spring flowers can also be a welcomed distraction from the baron landscape and there is still time to plant out spring bulbs.

With our vegetable gardens we should still be within the harvesting cycle of late summer crops. Our broccoli, cauliflower and cabbages should be nearing maturity if not already mature. This should also be the case with carrots and apples. We should see a great reduction in stone fruits however.

This month is a great opportunity for topdressing our lawns. Keeping this in tip top condition throughout the cooler months will in turn provide a fantastic backdrop to any garden come spring.

Like with anything horticulturally related, the yearly cycle is such that most parts of our gardens and lawns will need attention throughout the year. Vigorous maintenance will keep everything in peak condition, spraying and feeding, pruning and weeding all pays off in the long run.

Taihape Amenities Building hits next phase of construction

A milestone has been reached this week and site set up and ground works are complete.

The site has been marked out for the piles and the contractors have begun driving them in.

Living up to the Gumboot Capital title, the construction team have removed very soft clay and soil from the site and replaced it with gravel. This will create better drainage and allow heavy machinery to come and go more easily.







Did you know?

We are installing energy efficient showers. As the warm water washes down the drain it heats the clean water you use to shower. Each shower will have a spirex energy drain that coils around the clean water pipe allowing it to absorb the heat from the wastewater.

There is no cross contamination between the pipes. This technology reduces our carbon footprint and the cost to heat the water.
