Shared Accommodation/Group Home Background

The Taihape Community Development Trust and the Taihape Housing Steering Group are investigating the development of an affordable and attractive family-style home on the flat or at the hospital campus in Taihape for mature residents 65+ years of age who would like to live independently in their own suite (bedsit, ensuite bathroom, patio, and small garden area), while enjoying the companionship, comfort, social life, and security provided by a communal residence.

Each resident will be completely independent and come and go as they please, with house rules and day-to-day operations developed by and overseen by a volunteer committee. A housekeeper/manager will provide general support, clean the shared areas, provide breakfast supplies, and prepare the two main meals each day.

A couple of questions have been provided;

Questions

1. Are you interested in becoming a resident of a family-style group home in Taihape with others who are 65+ years, independent and mobile, and wish to enjoy the companionship of people like yourself?
2. Are you willing to make a down payment to reserve your place as a resident in a potential group home in Taihape?

If either of the above questions appeal to you, please contact the Taihape Community Development Trust/Taihape Housing Steering Group on (06) 388-1307 and a representative will contact you to invite you to an informational meeting to learn more about this opportunity.

Community Comments February 2022

While 2022 is a new year it remains one of uncertainty and concern. Under the circumstances it is easy for negativity to creep in but let us all “play by the rules” and support each other to remain positive.

The first Workshop for the Board on Wednesday 2nd had a very full agenda with plans and projects discussed. To start on a positive note the Board congratulates Sandra Spiers on the award of the QSM for services to first aid within the community for many years. It is an award well deserved as through “hands on” and tutoring many have benefitted from Sandra’s knowledge. Another positive act was the rather different Christmas Parade that brought a smile to many faces especially the children and a big thankyou goes to TCDT and the “merry band” from the Fire Brigade.

The Board continues to work on existing projects and plan ahead - at the Dog Park there has been tightening of wires, extra boarding, and improvement to the entrance. The Park was well used over the holiday period and users that I spoke with commented that they have made Taihape their stopping place of choice because of the park and that is what we like to hear.

Unfortunately, not everyone appreciates what is provided and it is disappointing to see vandalism occurring. The Board has arranged for this to be rectified. We are still waiting for RDC to provide concrete pads under the picnic tables to avoid the constant moving of these for mowing.

Plaques, directional signage, and story boards together with renewed plantings will all make our community a more interesting and attractive place to visit. I am hoping the National Library website and Papers Past will give me additional information for our planned “Railway” display and remember the Board would appreciate input from the community.

But the issue on which the Community Board will be asking for input from community members is the future of our Town Hall. This is an important issue for our town and district, and we assure you we will share what information we can. We have already asked RDC to prioritise the discussion, but we need to hear from you all to support our request. The Board is currently discussing just how this can be done.

The COVID-19 Protection Framework



Lowest restrictions

- Businesses (bars, cafes, hairdressers, gyms, and more) and events (weddings, funerals, church services, music festivals, etc) across the country **can open with no restrictions when using vaccine certificates**. People with no certificate cannot enter the premises.
- Record keeping (signing a book or scanning in with the app) required, mask use required on domestic flights and encouraged indoors.
- Essential businesses like supermarkets and pharmacies do not use the certificates.
- These **essential businesses and businesses choosing not to use certificates** generally have a limit of 100 people, with 1m distancing, seated and separated where applicable.



Like Green with extra protections

- Masks now also required for all public transport, taxis, retail, and public venues. Also required for supermarkets and essential
- Public facilities and retail have capacity limits based on 1m distancing (including supermarkets).
- Schools and other education settings are open but have some additional public health measures.
- Stricter rules for businesses not using vaccine certificates: Close-contact businesses like hairdressers, events and gyms must close; hospitality is contactless only; gathering limits lowered to 50.



Like Orange but even more protections

- Masks also 'recommended' whenever leaving the house.
- While hospitality, retail etc can be open if using vaccine certificates, a limit of 100 people and 1m distancing applies. Some additional requirements apply to close-contact businesses like hairdressers.
- Gathering limits reduced to 10 people for events not using certificates, including weddings, tangihanga, places of worship.
- Vaccine certificates required for on-site tertiary education.
- Working from home is encouraged.

FROM THE Mayor's Desk

I guess it was inevitable that we would drop back into the Red Traffic Light setting with the arrival of Omicron. Overseas experience shows that case numbers will rapidly build to the thousands per day nationally and the restrictions of the Red setting may help to prevent our hospitals and health organisations being overrun. I, like everyone, am disappointed that events are being cancelled, events where organisations will be out of pocket and where so much preparation work has already been done. However the messages are clear and we need to support the rules. There are practical things that we can do such as having a plan as to how we as households handle such things as our shopping, checking on family and neighbours, being able to support our people with non-contact shopping and having a plan for what will happen when we need to isolate are all incredibly important.

In a more positive vein, I continue to be astounded by the great things that are taking place in all of our communities - supporting those in need, rebuilding our parks and reserves and so many other outstanding achievements. It is time that we publicly recognise some of our great people and I have asked staff to help me put on a District Honours Night. At some stage we will need to go out seeking nominations for those inaugural names.

Last week we had the reopening of the Marton RSA & Citizens' Memorial Hall. This was a refit that was funded by both Government and Council. I was stunned at what the building now looks like with the

asbestos removed, new lighting and upgrades in showers and toilets – a full makeover. This was something that was long overdue and I would like to thank the number of local businesses that were part of making this happen.



There is work being undertaken right across our district at the moment - Memorial Park in Taihape is continuing, with contracts let and we look forward to that work starting. The Mangaweka Bridge is nearing completion and will need opening and in Bulls the Bus Lane work is also nearing completion. We have much to be proud of.

Gardening in Taihape

Welcome to gardening in 2022. Leading off from last year's gardening tips, we are well advanced into the dry season and if your garden has been well maintained then your garden should still be green and lush. It should still have an abundance of life with an exception of the lawn.

As the hot dry weather continues many vegetables and fruits will be in abundance and maturity whilst many of our shrubs and trees will be near the end of the growing season.

In the vegetable garden, our cabbages and broccoli will start making vigorous growth if they haven't already and we should be picking our cucumbers to ensure and to encourage more fruit growth and we can use our smaller crops for pickling. The key throughout the summer months is watering.

In the flower garden, lightly prune your roses to remove any dead heads and pieces that haven't stood up to the elements. I find that while I'm dead heading, I allow myself to bring unruly rose bushes back into shape. I have found this particularly useful when it comes to large shoots to end up top heavy and snap, a good pruning down produces flowers lower and reduces the risk of snapping limbs. The key however in the flower department is also watering.

For those lawn connoisseurs among us the autumn sowing period is rapidly approaching and maintenance and preparations for new lawns should be considered. A few small steps taken each season will bring our gardens back and keep them in tip top condition.

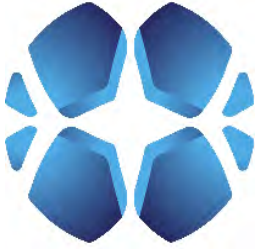

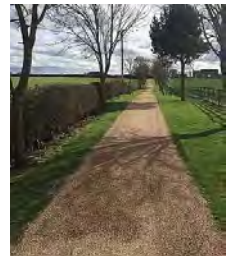
