Here is a some News! Change to Rangitikei District Council ward structure from 5 to 3

Prior to this year's local body elections in October Rangitikei has reviewed its ward structure and made changes to the number of wards and boundaries. Rangitikei will now be comprised of the Northern, Central, and Southern Wards.

Here are the key changes:

- The ward structure will reduce from 5 to 3. Taihape (slightly expanded becomes the Northern Ward), Hunterville and Marton combine to be the Central Ward Bulls, and Turakina combine to be the Southern Ward
- The number of elected councillors remains the same at 11 with 3 councillors elected by the electors of the Northern ward; 5 councillors elected by the electors of Central Ward; and 3 councillors elected by the electors of the Southern Ward
- The Ratana and Taihape Community Boards will continue as now: each have four elected members together with (for Ratana) one member appointed from the Southern Ward and with (for Taihape two members from the Northern Ward.

The process to change current ward structure must be approved by the Local Government Commission (LGC). There were 4 appeals to the LGC against the Council's final proposal, but after hearing the appeals LGC upheld Rangitikei District Council's proposal. The appeals centred around ensuring that smaller communities were adequately and fairly represented in the new ward structure.



Talk up Taihape



Welcome to my May update on the current real estate market.

I trust everyone enjoyed their Easter break and quality time with family during the School Holidays.

Now that the cooler months have arrived one would expect the property market in Taihape and surrounds to be cooling also however this is not the case in our Taihape Property Brokers office (

We have plenty of enquiries from out of town buyers especially since prices in neighbouring regions have escalated and listings are thinning out pretty much everywhere including here in Taihape.

So what is driving this demand ?

The NZ housing market has been subjected to a number of drivers over the past few years, the fundamentals supporting this demand include:

- Strong population growth and a sluggish supply response to housing supply.
- The strong labour market, which supports household investment appetites
- Improving household incomes
- Low mortgage interest rates
- The gradual relaxation of the RBNZ's high loan to value lending restrictions (LVR) for investors and owner-occupiers.

The Manawatu/Whanganul and Hawkes Bay/Gisborne regions are growing at a very strong rate, with quarterly price growth over the First Quarter of 4% in Manawatu/Whanganul and 3.3% growth in Gisborne/Hawkes Bay.

Price growth in these regions appears to be fuelled by a lack of listings for potential buyers. Without a lift in new listings, along with increased demand due to lower interest rates, which are predicted to drop even further in the near future, we expect house price growth to remain strong in these regions over 2019.

Auckland's housing shortage has spread across the country causing these regions to now experience this shortfall in housing supply as the pick-up in regional population outpaces regional dwelling construction.

Also now that the Labour Government has ultimately decided to not introduce a capital gains tax, we are seeing housing demand has picked up as investors feel more confident moving forward,

There has also been a sharp increase in rents with supply being stretched, however as new house construction is completed over and beyond 2019 the expectation is that eventually housing supply will catch up with the new demand from population growth and this will reduce the upward pressure on house prices outside the main centres.

So if you are thinking of selling now is a very good time to list your property while the demand is strong and the supply is low.
