FROM THE Mayor's Desk

Last week I attended Mamma Mia – I see it even made Seven Sharp this week! It was scheduled to be done much earlier this year, and due to Covid-19 was delayed, and I was



really pleased it was able to happen. I have sent my congratulations to all involved it was a truly upbeat and professional show. It was virtually sold out for 9 performances - which means that every man and his dog in Taihape pretty much attended.

The Long Term Plan will be the most significant document that this Council has ever put in place, because of changes to population and the high volume of capital build that we have planned. This is the replacement of aged infrastructure to comply with legislation, earthquake prone building laws, and compliance with wastewater and drinking water standards. We want to engage with as many groups and people as we can, I never turn anyone away, if you interested in meeting with me and /or our Councillors please contact me through our office on 0800 422 522 or 027 617 7668. Timings for engagements across our District will be publicised soon.

I made several comments recently about the changes the Government is looking at, for what we refer to as "the three waters space". Essentially this is where the Government is looking at amalgamation between councils for wastewater, potable and drinking water. This is likely to mean that Council's assets go to a private entity and you would be rated separately for the delivery, e.g. similar to the

model for provision of drinking water in the Greater Auckland area.

The difficulty for our Council and every other council is we don't know the details of these impacts on us and so the rest of this year will be spent understanding the effect on our ratepayers.

Very shortly we will be voting in the Government elections. Part of that process seems to be the government's desire to promote the rural and regional economy through the Provincial Growth Fund (or Minister Jones's) fund. I spent a day following the Minister around while he made announcements to Manawatū, Palmerston North and Whanganui, I am hopeful that the government will meet this month and we will be in position to make a positive announcement for Rangitikei.

Lately I have heard several people talking about the cold conditions in their homes. I am aware there is a government subsidy programme that is available for some homes in our District, there are subsidies up to 90% for those that qualify, so I would urge you to consider insulation and contact the experts to see if you qualify – here is a link to more information - www.energywise.govt.nz/tools/warmer-kiwi-homes-tool.

GARDENING IN TAIHAPE

August ushers in the last month of winter and the anticipation of spring but we are not out of the woods in terms of winter's grip on the garden. It's time to start thinking about the ground and paying attention to the health of your soil. Remove any weeds and add food and fertiliser the soil to improve the growing medium. In the vegetable department it's a good opportunity to keep and turn those compost heaps and apply the well rotted compost to the ground, also adding animal manure if necessary.

Remember to plant new season spring vegetables from previous months sowings and harvest vegetables such as Broccoli, cabbage, leeks and silver beet and continue to pick those winter leafy lettuces also.



In the flower department we will notice that our flowering bulbs such as daffodils, jonquils and hyacinths will be eagerly awaiting blooming if they haven't already in slightly warmer conditions. Nurture them along with this process by removing any weeds or garden debris that may impede this process.

The 15th of August through to the 23rd is the *Department of Conservations - Conservation Week* which is another brilliant opportunity to get out in your garden and immersed in nature among the many unique flora and fauna endemic to New Zealand. Taihape is a great place to see some of these with our various bush walks and tracks. **This FEATURE is written with advice from the Taihape Garden Club.**

I never like to single people out for thanks as it is so easy to overlook some but as we enjoy a near normal way of life again a big thank-you must go the Taihape Community Response Team co-ordinated by the Neighbourhood Support Group and to the volunteers and essential workers who together ensured the health and welfare of our community. To the cast and crew of Mama Mia, thank-you for a great show only made possible by many, many hours of practise and organising for the enjoyment of the community. The recent review on TV1's Seven Sharp was a show case of local talent and community spirit.

Taihape as a Motorhome Friendly Town was featured in the latest Motor Caravanner magazine and again Taihape was portrayed in a positive way . Sadly it seems to be the way that with the good comes the bad and it was disappointing to read of recent vandalism – broken glass, littering, unsightly 'wheelies' on grass verges. Essential Fatty Acids

They're deemed essential fatty acids because they're necessary for health but cannot be made by your body. Rather than being stored and used for energy, they play important roles in many bodily processes, including inflammation, heart health, and brain function.

What are omega-3 fats?

Essential Fatty Acids

Omega-3 fats are healthy unsaturated fats. There are three types of omega-3 fats:

- ALA (alpha linoleic acid)
- DHA (Docosahexanoic acid)
- EPA (Eicosapentaenoic acid)

Omega-3 fats play a role in brain, nerve and eye development in infants. They also help keep your immune system healthy and may help lower the risk of heart disease in adults.

ALA is mostly found in plant foods.

DHA is very important for brain development and may protect against heart disease, cancer, and other health problems.

EPA is an omega-3 fatty acid that can reduce symptoms of depression, and fight inflammation in your body.

EPA and DHA are generally considered the most important omega-3 fatty acids.

What foods contain omega-3 and omega-6 fats?

Omega-3 fats are found in:

- fatty fish like salmon, mackerel, anchovies, sardines, arctic char and trout
- eggs (including omega-3 enriched)
- flaxseeds and flaxseed oil
- walnuts
- tofu
- canola oil

What are omega-6 fats?

Omega-6 fats are also healthy unsaturated fats. There are four types of omega-6 fats:

- LA (Linoleic acid)
- ARA (Arachidonic Acid)
- GLA (Gamma linoleic)
- CLA (Conjugated linoleic acid)

Omega-6 fats play an important role in regulating our genes and promoting immune health and blood clotting. These fats can also help with the symptoms of arthritis and skin issues.

Omega-6 fats are found in:

- soybeans
- corn
- safflower and sunflower oils
- nuts and seeds
- meat, poultry, fish and eggs

They're mainly found in seafood, including fatty fish and algae, meat and dairy from grass-fed animals, and omega-3-enriched or pastured eggs. Even if you eat a lot of these foods, you may still want to consider supplements
