#### Taihape Heritage Committee - The Grandstand

We have come to a point where a group of people are prepared to lead a focus on our Memorial Park Grandstand. The building is 96 years old and requires a sizeable amount of money spent, to bring it back to where it should be.

We have lagged in the Rangitikei, over the years, to acknowledge and maintain our heritage buildings (the Manawatu and Wanganui regions are much more pro-active). Sometimes we also struggle in Taihape when our District Council base is essentially the Marton area.

Our Taihape Grandstand, is in fact, quite special. It is large and one of only 4 or 5 remaining in NZ, built at the recreation/park grounds. Presented properly this structure could symbolise Taihape more significantly.

The Memorial Park grounds are very well kept and the elevated views from the Grandstand over the fields towards the redwoods are superb. It is central to the Park, yet only metres from a nearby street and certainly directly serves any sport or event on the main field. It would be disappointing if one day our Memorial Park did not have the presence and status of the Grandstand that our forbears built in the memory of fallen soldiers.

The building has functioned over the years as a pivot for events. The large ground floor area (320m2 approx) can accommodate a sizeable shower area, up to 6 changing rooms & toilets, catering areas, medical rooms and storage. But also seating a good number of people at an elevated level out of the rain or sun. Its role is exemplified when the twin central front doors are open and sports teams emerge for the "Big Match". How Lucky Are We?

Make no mistake – our "Rec Grounds" are still very well used during the year. Sport is a large part of Taihape lives and provides a sense of community, which is shared with many visitors. There are numerous codes of sport involved but rugby alone has 18-20 weeks straight with multiple teams playing Saturdays and mid-week practices.

The most logical way to achieve the goal of a refurbished Grandstand on its 100<sup>th</sup> birthday is to reinstate its function and purpose. It may not be in the "best" place for all Park users. But it is already there and still suits a large part of the community.

The Rangitikei District Council has for a very long time been trying to solve our Park issues. They have set aside funds and have definite intentions to build a separate toilet, shower and changing block near field 3 and the tennis courts. (Please note that there is <u>no</u> "Hub" or inside social area. No upstairs – a single story build only.) It has taken years of meetings and is excellent news for those needing a hot shower.

BUT this also represents one huge – last minute – opportunity to place and re-place these facilities under the Grandstand and thereby secure it's future by giving it back function.

Meaning no new building taking up one of the tennis courts with the associated costs of new water, power, sewerage which we already have.

The Taihape Heritage group believe that to spend over \$1m of our (ratepayer) funds on a separate ablutions block build and then leave the Grandstand to flounder is nonsense and lacks all efficiencies. It is clear also that there is simply not the wealth to do both

Our Heritage Group wish to circulate a petition to establish support. Please be encouraged to take part. It will be outside **New World on the 11th July 10am to 2pm.** Also in the near future at Coffee HQ (railway) and at REAP, 1 Tui St.

"Our intention from the very start was to bring some joy to the region, and that's needed now more than ever. This musical is the perfect way to bring people together."

The cast are now back at rehearsals for the West End favourite, set to the music of ABBA and featuring classics such as Dancing Queen, Mamma Mia and Money Money Money.

Mamma Mia's sold out run will now take place at the Taihape Town Hall from 28 July to 1 August. Plus, three new shows have been added; an opening night on 24 July, and a matinee and evening show on 25 July.



# FROM THE Mayor'S DESK

Last week saw the conclusion of the District Plan hearings proposing a change for some land from rural to industrial.

The decision now rests with the Commissioner



We have a number of live applications submitted to Minister Jones's Provincial Growth Fund (PGF). I have already advised publicly that we have a potential rail siding as part of this process. There has also been requests by Government for us to submit shovel-ready projects for funding, which we have done - these are projects that are ready to go and would create employment if they were approved now. But bear in mind that every Council and organisation in New Zealand has the same opportunity - and it is a first in firstserved basis. However the good news is that the outcome of these applications will be told to us in a timely manner - a decision is expected within the next two weeks, so I am waiting with bated breath.

As part of the Council's Annual Plan process I had envisaged meeting with a large number of community groups across our district, until this was prevented by alert levels during our COVID-19 pandemic. I'm happy to start this process now, even though the Annual Plan has been adopted by Council, I see this as a two-step process - I will answer any questions around the 2020/21 Annual Plan and also start gathering information towards our Long Term. Plan process. Lam happy to meet any member. of the community individually, but would prefer to meet with community groups, right. throughout the district - I can be contacted directly on my cellphone (027 617 7668) or ring me at the Council on 0800 422 522.

As everybody is aware the issue of the Captain James Cook statue in Marton was raised when we were alerted it was likely to be vandalised, the decision was made to protect the statue until Council engaged with local iwl, Runanga Ngā Wairiki Ngāti Apa, to understand their view. Subsequently, last week Council issued a joint public statement by Pahia Turia, Chair of Runanga Ngá Wairiki Ngáti Apa and myself as Mayor. In summary the statement said the statue should remain, but the plaque would be removed. We also agreed to start an education programme, for both European and Maori on early history and heritage. We are fortunate in our district to have a fantastic relationship with iwi, which enables us to have a genuine. frank discussion about issues such as this. It is certainly time that we knew more about our District's early history. The bonus with the issue around the Captain Cook statue has given us the opportunity to have that conversation. This of course not a position that is particular to Marton, the wider northern district is currently involved in sensitive negotiations around the settlement process with the Crown. I have attended a number of the hearings where the stories of our early District are told, I am embarrassed by some of the actions of the early Councils of the day. We do need to tell these stories right across our District.

#### GARDENING IN TAIHAPE

just a round the comer. This is a good opportunity for a final tidy up in the garden but as so often we see that wintery conditions can come later in Taihape. A prime time for planting out new shrubs, trees and roses in the irde sired locations as we eagerly a wait their first new shoots of the season.

This is a good time to be sowing dianthus, delphinium, begonia and gypsophila for new seasons colour.

In the produce department, we can prune grapes by cutting out all the dead and old wood allowing the new seasons' canes to flourish and begin sowing vegetables such as beetroot, broad beans, cabbage and carrots. Winter takes us through several stages of the gardening spectrum.



So wing, Thansplanting, Protecting, Fertilising and Harvesting. With that said Taihape has a unique growing climate and protection of young seed lings is a must with some of these very cool mornings so a frost free position is best. The Main Truck Brewery was established on the site in 1908 by



William Joseph Khutze who inherited the business and shifted it to Taihape to supply beer to the men working in timber milling and bush clearing in the area. He changed the family name during WWI to the more English and less German so unding Coutts. William Coutts became sick and was permanently disabled during the worldwide fluepidemic in 1918, and Morton, aged 15, took over the business from his father, later coming up with what is now known as the continuous fermentation process for brewing beer. You can view artifacts of the brewery at the Taihape Museum.

#### **Sheep Measles Outbreaks Around Taihape**

Ten sheep farms around the Taihape area and eight from Hunterville have been contacted regarding outbreaks of sheep measles in lambs, reports Dan Lynch, Project Manager, Ovis Management Ltd the meat industry company responsible for tracking the parasite *Cysticercus ovis* known as Sheep Measles. Sheep Measles is a parasitic infection of sheep meat spread by dogs carrying the *Taenia ovis* tapeworm.

Contractors, in particular, who take dogs with them onto farms pose a risk of spreading the disease so it is strongly encouraged that anyone taking a dog onto a sheep farm regularly has it treated monthly for sheep measles. The treatment is by pills specifically for tapeworms and these can obtained from local vets. While farmers are treating their dogs monthly to prevent sheep measles, these efforts are at risk any time a foreign dog comes onto the farm. To reduce the risk of infection more and more farmers are requiring treatment certificates to show dogs have been dosed or are banning external dogs altogether.

#### **Key Controls**

- \*Dose all dogs going on farms monthly
- \*Treat all sheep or goat meat by freezing or cooking
- \*Deter or ban all external dogs from entering sheep farms unless they have a current treatment certificate.


