Project Central Wind Consents Lapse

After twelve years of uncertainty Meridian Energy Ltd' (MEL), resource consents to build a 52 x 130metre turbine wind farm in the northern Rangitikei have terminated through disuse.

Having spent more than \$4million and been granted two re-consents by the Rangitikei District Council (RDC), MEL gave no material effect to the project during the consented period, also saying in a media piece that the consents were no longer fit for purpose.

However within days of the lapse date of 24 May 2020, letters were received by RDC, Mokai Patea and the Rangitikei Guardians from MEL to say that they would be seeking new consents towards the end of this year.

It has been great to be able to get back to Taihape to meet and talk with residents and businesses. Again I want to thank everyone who assisted with welfare support during COVID-19.



There have been some guestions raised that we need to come back with an answer to, one of the most topical being the heating (or lack of) at the Town Hall, especially with the production of Mamma Mia coming up. Quite rightly this question has been raised too by the Northern Ward Councillors. I have asked the Council's Chief Executive to look at what can be done. The difficulty has been the safety regulations and the inadequacy of the power supply. Once we have a preferred solution I will communicate that with the Taihape community.

I am pleased to announce that Rangitikei District Council was one of four rural

councils in New Zealand to be given \$100.000 to run a trial to assist with employment issues, post COVID-19. So we are delivering the Mahi Tahi Rangitīkei employment programme, in conjunction with Iwi and Nga Wairiki Ngati Apa Business and Education Hub. If you are under 25, or lost your job due to COVID-19, or an employer looking for staff and need a hand with training or costs please speak to James Towers, his email address is James.Towers@ rangitikei.govt.nz or phone him on 020 4168 6902. We are keen to use this funding to make this a successful trial.

I have also been in a number of discussions with the Ministry of Primary Industries (MPI) around the impacts of the drought on our District. We are collaborating with Manawatū District Council and MPI to work closely with our rural sector around resilience and well-being. MPI funding meant we could employ Jan Harris to assist with this work, which will support the work done by the existing Rural Support Trust. Mayor Andy Watson

Duck Ragout

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 3 rashers streaky bacon, chopped
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 2 medium carrots, chopped
- 1 stalk celery, sliced
- 1 tub swiss brown mushrooms, halved
- 1 cup red wine
- 300 ml good quality chicken stock
- 600 g wild duck breast fillets, sliced into fingers (skin off)
- 3 fresh bay leaves, 6 fresh sage leaves, 3 sprigs thyme
- kneaded butter for thickening
- Preheat oven to 140 C.
- Heat the olive oil in a cast iron casserole and gently cook the bacon, onion, carrot and celery until the onion is
- tender. Increase the heat and add the mushrooms,
- tossing for a minute or two.
- Pour over the red wine and allow to boil and reduce by half. Add the chicken stock, duck fillets and herbs. Season to taste with salt and freshly ground black pepper.
- Cover and place in the oven, cook for 3 hours, checking on liquid levels at times. Thicken sauce with butter kneaded with flour.
- Serves 4.
- Delicious, beautifully rich but not overly so. Creamy mash and wilted spinach are perfect accompaniments as is a good bottle of red!

GARDENING IN TAIHAPE

June 5th marked Arbour Day and World Environment Day. This day is often commemorated by environment groups around the country by planting new trees and we can do our bit at home too.

Clianthus puniceus or Kaka Beak (Ngutukākā) is a little know shrub that is endangered in New Zealand and government records show that as little as 150 trees remain in the wild. They have small clusters of striking red flowers also available in white that resemble the beak of a Kaka. Hence Ngutu meaning beak/lips and Kākā meaning the native parrot of the same name.

There are two species, both seriously threatened with extinction: The Clianthus puniceus and Clianthus maximus.

These shrubs or small trees will make a welcome



addition to any garden and furthermore help save them from extinction. They are available at many nurseries today.

With heavy frosts a daily occurrence now, wrapping tender plants and produce with frost cloth is a great option. Ideally plants should be wrapped right down to the ground for the best protection and making sure there is no exposed foliage or foliage touching the cloth itself. *Happy Gardening*.

DO YOU KNOW THIS **BUILDING?**

Methodism came to Taihape in 1895. The Wesleyan Church was the first church built in the town. opening in 1902.



The Taihape and Districts Museum and Historical Society initially leased, and then purchased the Methodist Church buildings. Both the interior and exterior of the church have been maintained as close as possible to the original and the meeting hall is still in use as a venue for museum committee meetings.

The Society was formed in 1970 and its artifacts were initially stored in an empty shop until the Society was offered the lease of the old church. The museum opened on its present site in 1975. The collections concentrate mainly local history. Farming, saw milling and the railway all played a large part in Taihape's history and this is reflected in the displays. It also houses an extensive (indexed) photographic collection as well as a biographical index. The museum is run by volunteers and is open Sunday 11am to 2pm .If you wish to visit or do research they will open on request . Www.taihapemuseum.co.nz
