Although it has been delayed by Covid, this journey into Taihape's heritage is almost at an end. Or, perhaps will it be the beginning as other names are submitted and researched in later years.

#### From Our Community Board

It is hard to believe that we are almost halfway through another year. Queen's birthday weekend has been and gone and Matariki is close.

The current Board has only three meetings left for the year - June 15<sup>th</sup>, August 17<sup>th</sup>, and October 5<sup>th</sup>. Of course, Local Body elections take place on October 8<sup>th</sup>.

Our small projects fund has enabled the Board to continue working on various projects but each one undertaken is planned to enhance our community. As you will have noticed the Tamatea Pokai Whenua Cairn storyboard is in place and the supporting posts have been painted, the yellow gumboots on the footpath have been repainted and will certainly brighten things up, the renovation of the northern events board ,an information board (or two) , photos to complete the Coin Save project, the concrete pads under seating at Quickstop planter boxes and a photographic display depicting the story of railways in Taihape are all getting closer to completion. I feel I must add here that the support and co-operation of local firms and community members has been great and most appreciated. Similarly, I have found Council staff I have spoken with lately have been most helpful also.

The request for the conservation of water notice recently was due to treatment plant maintenance requiring a 24-hour shut down. I have been making my way through the Manawatu- Whanganui Regional Climate change risk assessment, all 170 pages. Needless to say, it is a very comprehensive document and with the opening sentence of "Climate change is one of humanity's greatest challenges" it certainly grabs your attention. Risks for our district are listed as risks to storm-water infrastructure, commercial buildings, solid waste management, freshwater ecosystems, and freshwater recreation. Of course, "one hat does not fit all" and our rural communities face added risks and problems. Do familiarise yourselves with the Civil Defence Community Response Plan.

The new District Council funding rounds for 2022 and 2023 are now open. Local Clubs, community groups and sports teams will find further information on the District Council's website.

Recently I have discussed re-zoning with Council's Spatial planner and visited the Nga Awa build site and spoken with the Project Manager as to the future of the small pavilions on the former Croquet Lawns. As these are part of our community's past I was heartened to hear that they will not be demolished and if the Board supports the proposal some can be re-located within our "special" spaces in town eg the Outback, Gumboot Park. The new build is progressing well, and it is planned to have it completed around Christmas time (weather and availability of materials permitting)!

I meet monthly with Pania Winiata – this enables TCB and TCDT to share ideas and information and to support each other.

I will conclude with a friendly reminder that if you would like to be involved in Local Government do put your name forward.

FROM THE Mayor's Desk

On a sad note I recently attended the tangi for Charlie Rourangi at Rātana. Charlie had served on the Rātana Community Board for a couple of terms. The Community Board is how Council engages formally with the Rātana community. My sympathies as always lie with the whānau and community.

Over the last few weeks Council has been working on our 2022/23 Annual Plan and budgets and there were a number of themes coming through in the submissions. One of them was always going to be the rates increase of 7.29%. Several people asked why we had put in a note to say that the effect on individual properties would be less. So let me try and explain. The 7.29% indicated in the draft Annual Plan represents the increased budget, i.e. the total cost to run Council. However, we have had a significant number of new houses that we can rate and that effectively shares the rates burden. This is represented by about a 1% increase in the total capital value of the district, effectively lowering the rates per household by around 1% to an average per household increase of 6% for the next year.

There is more good news to come as well. Our district is growing quickly. If the industries come as indicated and housing continues to climb with the new subdivisions, the rates increase forecast will continue to drop. For example, if around 700 new homes are built that brings in about \$2m rates. If industry spends \$500m in capital buildings as indicated, their likely rates bill will be in excess of \$500,000 per year. All of these will take considerable pressure off rates. The second frequently asked question was why don't we have a development contributions policy to support the needed infrastructural growth? We



have an alternate system targeting greenfield development (new housing subdivisions) called a development agreement. This is where the cost of supply upgrades to cope with water, wastewater and stormwater demands is met by the developer under an agreed cost prior to work starting.

It is great to see the Mangaweka Bridge now open to all traffic, including heavy traffic and the work on the new amenities block in Taihape - Ngā Awa Block proceeding.



## **Taihape Community Gardens**

There are a few raised beds being topped up with mulch etc ready for planting out in early spring.

# Gardening in Taihape

### Layers in the Garden

Leading on with our winter theme of organising our spaces ready for the new growing year ahead this month we are going to talk about layers. A good planting scheme is like a collage, or a patchwork tapestry, where many layers come together to form a coherent scheme.

Different plants like to grow at different levels, ranging from those that prefer their heads in sunshine, such as clematis or wisteria, to those, that are happiest at ground level requiring the protection of the taller species in order to keep their heads in the comfort of the dappled shade like ferns.

Striking a good balance between the two can be tricky but also is very important. Think about that scheme you are trying to create and how best to achieve it. Plants with tall, medium and small growth habits are going to provide the range you need and it's as simple as reading the labels for this growing advise. Consider the look you want and the space you have. Also, a very important fact is to consider the seasons and the look these will give you throughout the year.

If you prefer year-round green then great. This will give you constant colour throughout the year even in the depths of winter. Otherwise, we plant for succession. This is an opportunity for plants to come and go throughout the seasons which in turn will also provide year-round interest.


Then on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> May, Taihape Rotary Club had a very successful fund-raising day on Targa Rally day.




