An update from the Grandstand sub-committee of the Taihape Heritage Trust

Heritage NZ listing:

On December 15th 2022 the Taihape Memorial Park Grandstand listing proposal goes before the board of Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga, for final approval.

It has been a journey of two years and three months to reach this last hurdle in protecting our iconic grandstand. In doing so ,the committee has learnt much about the listing process and how being listed can increase a building's life of use in this time of earthquake risk and in providing access to funding.

Working with the RDC:

The Rangitikei District Council (RDC) has come on board with the aim of preservation, and has set aside a sum of one million dollars in the current Long-Term plan to kick start preservation of the Taihape Memorial Park Grandstand. Currently, we are attempting to work closer with the RDC to ensure Taihape receives value for the time and money spent so far. We are still awaiting a draft of a heads of agreement, or a memorandum of understanding from the RDC that was being considered in May 2022 by the staff.

Strengthening a heritage building:

The committee understands that an independent engineer has approached the RDC regarding seismic strengthening of the Taihape Memorial Park Grandstand. As yet we have not been made aware of any details of that plan. The committee has met with RDC Staff and been briefed on the proposed forms of strengthening and the prospective costings.

Centenary:

In 15 months' time, 2024 will see the Taihape Memorial Park Grandstand reach its centenary. This will be a milestone worth celebrating. Planning will need to start early next year. Please start thinking about what different groups that you belong to, can do to celebrate this key date.

FROM THE Mayor'S DESK

Council has held its first meeting to induct Councillors and to outline committee structures.

There is a realisation for Councillors and staff that the workload this triennium will be far heavier than has been the case previously. The new responsibilities that Council have around Government legislation and the transition of Three Waters to separate entities, RMA reform etc is substantial. Council has decided that from now on workshops will be publicly notified and open to the general public, but not live-streamed. Standing Committees and Council meetings will also be open to the public and live-streamed.

The funding for roading both locally and nationally is challenging. All of us notice the potholes and decreased maintenance of our networks. This funding is principally set by Waka Kotahi grants and Government budgets. As I understand it those budgets will not be increased or reviewed until 2024, while the inflationary costs of roading per year arguably are approaching 30% per annum. There will be roads in NZ that are not reinstated after climatic events and the deterioration of local roads is sadly inevitable under this funding regime. Locally we also know that the impact of forestry harvesting is on us now as the "wall of wood" becomes a reality. We started looking at introducing a differential on roading rates for identified forestry properties in the Long Term Plan. We put that decision on hold to consult further with the sector, something that we are currently undertaking. We will add this consultation occurring now to be part of the Annual Plan consultation to give options that have been worked through with the industry.

Over the last couple of years attending school prizegiving functions has been a challenge with covid restrictions and as the community have been released from the covid prison it has been



pleasing to be able to attend a number of end of year school functions recently. As part of that we have awarded Council scholarships to rangatahi at Taihape Area School and Rangitikei College for tertiary education. I am keen for Council to also look at recognising and providing for apprenticeship funding across the district and there will be more to come on this matter.

Last month I had the pleasure of attending the Investiture of Judge Rachael Parata Mullins where she was admitted to the judicial bench as a judge in Taihape. This is a classic case of a local girl excelling, Rachael attended Taihape Area School and went on to study law, graduate and now be admitted as a judge. She had requested that investiture be held at the school and she was supported by approximately 400 people who had travelled from all over to attend the ceremony. One of her local teachers spoke in glowing terms of Rachael around what she has achieved and her community involvement. Quite an amazing powhiri and celebration to be part of.



Gardening in Taihape

Well summer should be in full swing by now but with some of these cooler mornings it may feel like it's not. However, our gardens will still be coming along and coming into full bloom. Pay attention to your garden's watering needs, despite all the rain we have had it's still a good idea to check moisture levels at this time.

We should be seeing rapid growth in the vegetable garden and with this added moisture fruits and veggies will be utilising that to their full potential. Continuation of successive sowing will see summer vegetables including beans, beetroot, and carrots in full production throughout the warmer months. Pay close attention to pests and mildew, these can be prevented through topical spraying with home remedies or store-bought applications.

Our flower beds will no doubt be in need of the same attention. Pest and mildew is best to be prevented rather than treated in

my opinion and also pay close attention to the bed's moisture levels. Winter mulching should help in the area. For those species that have a prolific flower cycle fertilise and keep well hydrated, prune off any spent blooms and encourage new growth. This also applies to our lawns. All round a bit



of attention for the specifics of pests, moisture and feeding will put your garden in great shape leading into the new year.

November Hui for Taihape Development

On the 25th November, Tracey Hiroa and Jude MacDonald along with Ngawini Martin and Janine Rider, facilitated a hui with Taihape community and stakeholders to share the progress that has been made with the development of moving back into the Taihape Rural Health Centre. Approximately 50 people attended including community people, Police leaders, leaders from Rangitikei Council community development team, local leaders such as councillor Jill Duncan, Elizabeth Mortland, Ruth Rainey, Les Rowlands and Kuia Byford and various providers such as Jigsaw Whanganui, Te Whatu Ora Whanganui and clinical leaders from Taihape Health Limited.

The intent of the hui was to revisit the purpose of the work, share how this collaboration met the intent and new direction for Health nationally, how the design has been changed to reflect the feedback we have received to date and to share how it will look and feel, given Duncan Sinclair the Architect from Blackpine played a 3D design model which helped people visualise the change. The team were thrilled with the positivity in the room and the encouragement we received from many of the people that were present. It was considered this development had the potential to really make an impact for the community.

To revisit the purpose, the main aim is to provide an integrated and collaborative way of working that connects whanau with a range of sectors and providers that work together to keep our community well.

We heard from Police Regional Commissioner Ross Grantham who was present, that working alongside providers, community and lwi made perfect sense to support the community as a collective. He and his team stated that they are committed to the direction towards collaborative action and look forward to being included in Whānau centred actions to help people remain well and supported. We talked about how we all had to start to 'lean in' and listen to the person that had the existing relationship with the Whānau and work together, rather than work in isolation from each other.

Tracey Hiroa shared that what she sees is not business as usual, but something that looks different and has us working in a different way and is Kaupapa driven. She talked about creating a new narrative and direction to inspire positive change. The facility changes are only just one part of the change process.

While THL will use part of the kitchen space for meals on wheels preparation, it is intended the space will be opened to offer two designated spaces that can be used by Whānau and the community for social activities, in the creation of a café with work experience opportunities for our young people, and a gathering place for meeting and chatting. We also heard that the community needed a place to wait when their Whanau was being cared for by Chris Bennett Undertaker, and therefore having access afterhours and at weekends without impacting on the security of the provider services was key. Raising funding for the public space refurbishment is a necessary next step, so we ask the community to think about where this funding could be accessed from.

We described the model design and its relevance to the Locality plan that is being developed currently. We see relationships as key and hearing the whanau voice as part of the care planning and decision making is known to reduce gaps. Changing our language to one of wellness and wellbeing so that we consider the person rather than the illness is also key. We are committed as providers to address stigma and discrimination and we are positive about adopting the application of a Te Ao Māori world view that looks at all the areas that determine wellness such as housing, education, health, social and economic factors. We believe in changing to this way of working will address equity and improve health and wellness for all the community.

Clearly maintaining a workforce that works well together is key. We announced the appointment of Ngawini Martin as the new Service Manager for Taihape Health Limited who replaces Gemma Kennedy who retired last week after many years working for the Taihape health services. Ngawini is currently transitioning from her role as a senior manager at Mōkai Patea Services and is the right fit to work alongside Sarah Collier at THL to ensure services are delivered well by a team that is well supported. Ngawini will also lead the merge of health and Whānau ora services into the RHC, and currently is working with Janine Rider to lead the design change with the teams. We have emphasised that the footprint of the RHC is the limiting factor for change, although Duncan reiterated very positively what a wonderful building and design the RHC is, so we are optimistic we will get a great working model.

Duncan has been meeting with some of our workforce who will be key in the first development phases. The X-Ray will be relocated to the RHC first, and the new machine is waiting in Wellington, and following the consent approval process we hope to get started on this design change in the new year. Jean Tapp will move with the service when it is up and running and the old X Ray machine will be decommissioned. Maternity redesign will come next, and the midwives have worked with Duncan to get the design right, with internal and external spaces which we think will be an improvement on the space that is currently utilised. The final change in that corridor is the establishment of a link corridor, linking the space that was a general practice (and then the laundry for the Resthome) with the clinical / whanau ora space. This will offer better access and use of the space in this corner of the complex and enable the team to provide an infectious space should covid 19 or any other pandemic or infectious disease process surge in the community. When the space is not used for that purpose it will be able to be used flexibly and feel more connected to the main areas in use.

Early conversations with Rangitikei Council leaders indicate that there is much we can do to work together and really collaborate to get the needs of the community met in a different way. We are encouraged by the parties that we have met with and the desire to work together. So community of Taihape, watch this space, change is happening !!!!

On behalf of the team that are driving this development, we wish to take the time to wish you all the very best for the festive season. Enjoy time with your whanau and friends and we look forward to getting you together again in early 2023.
