

FROM THE Mayor'S

ast week, we held our final Council meeting for the triennium where we farewelled Councillors Ash, Panapa, Gordon and Belsham - all of whom have served this district with distinction.

Councillor Gordon and Deputy Mayor Councillor Belsham have had the added responsibility of chairmanship of committees where their input has been invaluable. For those of us standing who may or may not be returning to the table, good luck. Congratulations to Councillors Coral Raukawa, Brian Carter, Tracey Hiroa and the incoming new Councillor Jarrod Calkin.

On 21 September, I, along with six other Mayors throughout the country, took our concerns over roading to the Board of Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency in Wellington. Mayors meeting with the Board is unusual and signified our concerns over the maintenance state of both local and national roading networks. We also questioned that successive Governments follow a three year cycle with limited long term views over roading priorities. Hopefully this meeting will result in a closer future working relationship with Waka Kotahi and the Government.

I'd like to send my congratulations to the organisers and presenters of the Bio-Polymer seminar held at Te Matapihi on 8 September. The information was well presented and painted a potentially fantastic



future for our district and the environment.

Continuing with the environment focus, on 30 August at Rangatira the Rangitikei River Catchment Collective held their AGM. The number of collectives is growing and the work that they do for the environment is spectacular. Roger Dalrymple, Mark Chrystall and the team need to be applauded for their efforts.

As my last message to the community this triennium - please vote. Who represents you is imported and too often we don't engage but criticise later. Thank you all for your support during this term, it has been an honour to serve as your Mayor.

From Our Community Board

The October meeting brought the term for the current Community Board to a close. I can only describe the term as challenging as we faced the pandemic, lockdowns, and mandatory measures together with my personal challenges which have seen me operating from afar!

I have enjoyed the "learning process" of being Chair. When I accepted the role I set myself goals, one being to communicate with the wider community and secondly to work together with the Development Trust and other organisations to make Taihape an attractive and interesting place to stop and stay awhile.

I have met regularly with Pania from the Trust, and we have shared plans and worked co-operatively on some. I thank our local iwi for sharing their stories and knowledge enabling the Board to understand the significance of the Tamatea Pokai Whenua Cairn and share it with others. I must also thank local businesses, organisations and our reliable "handy man" for the willingness they have shown to accommodate TCB work. I appreciate the effort they have all put in.

The "highs" for me have been the projects that this Board has been able to complete and I thank Board members for their input To mention a few we have completed (or very nearly) a successful Dog Park, upgrade of Coin Save street frontage, the northern Events Board, the story of the Tamatea Cairn, the upgrade of the defibrillators and repainting the yellow gumboot trail while just a "step away" from completion are the concrete pads under the picnic tables at Quickstop corner and the story of the railways. We are currently working with the Trust on the rejuvenation of the main street. Toilet facilities in the Cemetery have been discussed plus the provision of water for handwashing on entry and leaving is planned. The connection of water to the Dog Park has been investigated but the cost is currently prohibitive.

The "lows" for me have been brought about by the pandemic - I have not had the contact with the Council and staff in Marton that would have been beneficial. The recent bout of vandalism, graffiti and grass berm damage realty are so very disappointing plus my ability (or rather lack of) to Zoom has been challenging to all 11 Thanks to our local RDC staff, Council members and fellow Board members for your patience. You have all been great support. A special thank-you must go to Michelle for her support during the pandemic.



Gardening in Taihape

By now we should be seeing the first pay off from our winter labours in the garden. October brings the full blossom of prunus and fruit and provides a delicate colour through the garden to usher us into the warmer season ahead, this can be one of the busier times in the garden also. This is a time for the ground to be at its most fertile for the preparation of new crops.

In the vegetable section we can start planting the warm season vegetable as the soil temperatures begin to rise but do be wary of these late frosts. Good generous amounts of compost and fertiliser will see you through the warmer months with a bumper crop. However, the sowing of summer vegetables outdoors too early can result in failure, as stated be wary of those late frosts. Germination in pots or punnets can be a good idea before planting.

Flowering shrubs and roses should now be producing the first buds for the season ahead. As will pests be visible. Cleaning out old and spent flowers and shrubs should be discarded and replanted a new, make the most of the rapid growth on flowers and shrubs as this can be ideal to fill in gaps in the garden beds. Spraying for pests is a must if you are prone to aphids and blackspot, however, be aware of the, no busy activity of bees in the garden too. Use topical sprays that are harmless to bees like Super Shield by Yates, alternatively an organic spray.

Our lawns too will be fast growing and needing regular attention. Make the most of the spring rains as this is ideal for taking nutrients from fertiliser to the roots without the need to water in.


