FROM THE *Mayor's Desk*

It is with great sadness that I acknowledge the recent passing of Terry Steedman, Ngāti Hinemanu / Ngāti Paki.

I attended Terry's service at Winiata Marae with Councillor Gill Duncan, a service attended by a huge number of people and a large number of army veterans many of whom had served with Terry in Vietnam. Terry had given many years of service to our Council and community, serving on TRAK (Te Roopuu Ahi Kaa). I have had a friendship going back with Terry for a large number of years and respected that he always gave me his views which at times were strong and he will be sorely missed.

Last weekend was the weekend of the A&P Show/Shearing Sports/Gumboot Day in Taihape and the organisers made the right decision to cancel the Gumboot Day and A&P Show. The weather was programmed to be atrocious. The shearing sports continued as part of the national shearing circuit and I watched for some time. My congratulations go to the organisers – it can't have been easy making sure there were semi-dry sheep for the shearing and the difficulty they faced in getting truck and trailer units down to the stands. My congratulations go specifically to the trucking companies and Joe Coogan for providing the assistance that was required on the day.

I understand the frustration that people in Taihape must have around State Highway 1 and the access especially between Taihape and Marton. There are a huge number of roadworks going on at the moment and it seems as though virtually every road cone in

New Zealand seems to be centred on this area of road. However it's important this resealing takes place and it needs to happen during a tight timeframe through summer when conditions are at their best. I sympathise with Waka Kotahi – their budgets like our Council budgets are extremely tight and they are having to face major reconstruction on roads right throughout northern New Zealand at the moment due to extreme weather events. We need to come to understand that this is the new norm and our planning needs to reflect that.

Council is currently heavily involved with our Annual Plan budget rounds. The inflationary pressures on all Councils at the moment are extreme. The cost of doing roadworks has increased by somewhere between 20 and 30%. Councillors are involved in a huge number of workshops to nail down a consultation budget that will go out in late March looking for submissions to be held for the adoption of the Annual Plan in June.

Thanks to those who have submitted names for recognition of the volunteers in our district. By the time you read this nominations will have closed and the Committee is looking forward to shortlisting and the awards function to be held at Te Matapihi in March to announce the winners.

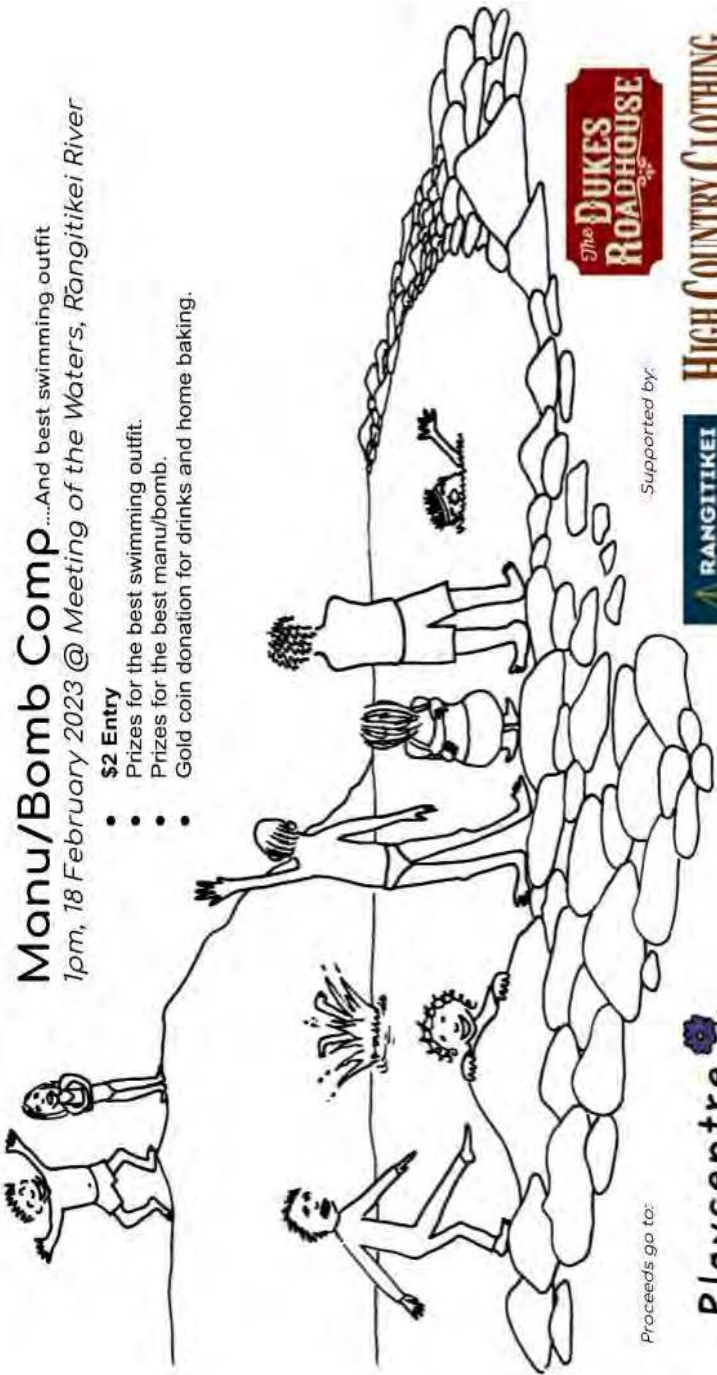

NATUROPATH

New News !

Recently whilst my mum stayed with us in the holiday season, we watched the 6pm news on TV.

2 great news clips to share with you from that 1 news programme;

Firstly; a study had just been completed from Massey university regarding cow's grazing on Plantain. The findings from this study being that the cows were healthier on this food source.

Does this mean that cows on crops which are faster growing grasses, essentially a mono-diet, be harmful to their digestive systems, and their general wellbeing? Would that also mean their digestive systems produce more gas?

How would we humans fair on a mono-diet? An example could be if you ate only apples, or burgers for breakfast, lunch and dinner – how good is that on the human digestive system, and how healthy would we be? Does the burger or apple diet (example only) give us all the nutrients we need for a healthy, well balanced body? Similarly, does a mono diet work for cows? Massey University have found that incorporating Plantain in their diet, helps to the overall wellbeing of the cows in this study.

I recall a programme on Country Calendar years ago demonstrating cows on 2 dairy farms. Of the 2 farms, one of them grazed their cows on a varied diet, of many types of plants, some which would be considered as weeds,

were milked once per day, and the herd small. The second farm showed cows in a larger, conventional dairy farm- essentially on fast growing, mono-crop type grass, and milked 2 times per day. The cows from the second farm shown in the programme, showed prominent hips and ribs, with more liquid bowel motions. The first farm, the cows very well nourished, in good physical condition, with solid bowl motions.

Second news flash; that a human diet of 2 days fasting, and then 5 days of eating what you want – isn't actually that healthy for you. In more detail, the 2 days fasting, means no eating for 12, 16, 18hours. The participant apparently chooses the length of time fasting. This type of eating wont suit those who have fluctuating blood sugars, as those people need more regular meals to keep their blood sugar levels more even (and often their mood – if we are hungry some of us can get a little “cranky”) There are choices in the fasting times apparently. On the fasting days – the foods are essentially proteins, fruits and vegetables (Which all of us would benefit from) and the other 5 days in the week are “Eat whatever you Like”. Burgers, pizza's, fish and chips, chocolate, chippies and so on! – the article suggested these latter foods are actually not healthy for us!!

Gardening in Taihape

If your garden has been well maintained then this will still be visible through the strong growth and vibrant colours coming through.

Even after all this rain we have seen it is still important to check on moisture levels throughout the garden. As we usually have more hot and dry conditions, the longevity of our gardens visibly has been pushed out, when this should indicate the end of their main growth season.

Our vegetables and fruits will be enjoying the much-needed extra moisture and will still be coming into maturity. However, moisture levels will still need to be maintained during the few dry days. Picking summer crops like cucumbers as they come to maturity will encourage new growth and further production of fruit. It's likely that summer pests will be a problem at various stages throughout the summer so pay close attention to this also.

Flowering species will also be hit by pests during this time and may also benefit from having a spray or two. Lightly pruning our roses and dead heads will encourage new growth for a second blooming. The constant rain will have also caused a fair bit of damage and any damaged, diseased or rotten foliage should be removed to allow fresh growth to come through.

Pay close attention to lawns and containers also. Where possible irrigate both to keep them green and vibrant, this is also a great time to prepare for implementing a lawn in the autumn and refreshing these spent container plants.

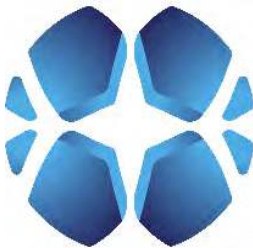
