FROM THE Mayor's Desk

🗅 angitīkei fortunately suffered a low level of Kdamage during Cyclone Gabrielle .

People have been guestioning me around how they can help and asking what is Council doing to help Hawke's Bay, Tararua, Gisborne, Wairoa and other districts. We have as a Council sent a response team with our solar powered communication system to the Hawke's Bay which has been much appreciated. My thanks to Hew and Roger Dalrymple and the other companies that have trucked over vegetables and stock feed etc. One of the difficulties is still getting supplies to where they are most needed or being able to move sheep/cattle off farms. The Local Government family is working out how we can best support the affected areas. If you would like to support some of our neighbours who've been affected by Cyclone Gabrielle, the best way you can do this is by providing financial support. You can do this by donating to some of the registered charities or the Givealittle pages listed on our website home page - Supporting those affected by Cyclone Gabrielle.

Recent Council meetings have focused on putting together a draft Annual Plan to go out for consultation. That draft should be available after the Council meeting in March. The inflationary pressures on all Councils at the moment is extreme, especially in the roading and salary categories. Various reports for instance give

the increased cost of repairing and rebuilding roads to be in the range of a

20-30% increase in terms of cost. This is challenging and in my view the 2.5% inflation cost that we put into place when budgeting the Long Term Plan a year ago is unachievable. Council will need to consider what rate increase is both realistic and affordable for our communities. The workshops so far have



proved the difficulty of that task. What we are seeing anecdotally around the country coming out in the press is that some Councils are looking at increases well in excess of 10%. I don't believe that we will be in that position however to keep our rates affordable we may well need to review what services we provide.

Finally, the last national Census was a disaster, with a large number of people not engaging or filling out census forms. Many people either thought it was only for landowners and not for people renting or just simply unimportant. Census figures and data are incredibly important - as a Council we use this information to look at such things as housing needs, assisting in our growth planning and understanding social needs. Often people say things to me like "we need better health support or more police personnel in our district". Government support and education, health, policing and much more is planned for by using census data. Simply put, it generates money and support for Rangitikei.

Finding the Root Cause of Fatigue

With the recent COVID-19 pandemic, the impact of viruses on long-term immunity and energy levels has been bought into sharp focus. Research shows that viruses can persist in the body, evading host immune and inflammatory defences, in addition to impacting mitochondrial function. The outcome of viral persistence is physical and mental fatigue along with immune system dysfunction presenting as a decreased resistance to infection.

Most viral and some bacterial illnesses are followed by a self-limiting period of fatigue, however, in some cases it can linger for weeks or even months post-infection, known as postviral fatigue syndrome (PVFS). When PVFS lasts longer than 6 months, it is considered chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS). As such, the World Health Organisation (WHO) classifies PVFS under the same category of as myalgic encephalomyelitis (ME)/(CFS). PVFS is considered a chronic neurological disease; with no defined aetiology, diagnostic tests or defined medical biomarkers.

Characteristics of post-viral fatigue syndrome

PVFS is characterised by long-term fatigue and other symptoms that severely limit a person's ability to carry out ordinary daily activities. A patient with PVFS may also experience non-restorative sleep, brain fog, orthostatic intolerance, myalgia, headaches, joint pain, and tender lymph nodes, in addition to a multitude of other immune, neurological and autonomic symptoms. A key feature of this condition is malaise that worsens following minimal physical or mental exertion, which can persist for days, which is not relieved by adequate rest or sleep. The progression of illness is prolonged and includes cycles of relapse and remission.

Treatment considerations

Naturopathic and herbal treatments help to modulate immune responses, improve mitochondrial function, increase cytoprotection, in addition to provide symptom relief. Adaptogens are indispensable to an PVFS treatment plan and are key to improving the health outcomes.

Adaptogens (plants and mushrooms that help your body respond to stress, anxiety, fatigue and overall wellbeing) prevent and treat respiratory infections and play a vital role in convalescence. They increase resistance to viral infections, inhibit severe inflammatory progression and promote recovery and wellbeing. Clinical studies show several adaptogens can modulate innate and adaptive immunity, promote anti-inflammatory activity, provide cytoprotection and repair by inducing detoxification and antioxidant pathways in damaged cells and directly inhibit viral docking and or replication. They reduce the effects of toxic stress by increasing resilience and adaptability by acting as 'stress mimetics'.



Gardening in Taihape

With all the rain we have had over the summer it has brought the garden back to life. Garden and flower beds should be bursting with life and if it's anything like mine a full array of green.

The main harvesting of apples and late stone fruits should have begun, this is the month for harvesting most orchid fruits and tidying up these fruit trees. Some spraying may be required but after all this wild weather it should be a matter of timing any broken and loose limbs.

New lawn areas could be implemented this month and tidying up of those patchy areas. Sowing new seeds sounds easy but be mindful of trying to get the right seed for your specific needs, this can make all the difference down the track when it comes to maintenance and general wear and tear.

Mulching Trees

A good tip for trees is to mulch the base. When mulching around our trees keep mulch and grass clipping free of the trunk. It is best to create donuts around the tree base rather than piling it up and smothering the trunk. Feed before applying the layer of mulch or if need be spray first to ensure a clear drip line around the base and use the mulch to lock in all that moisture for a successful growing season next year.
