FROM THE *Mayor's Desk*

Clean-up from the flood event last month seems to have gone reasonably smoothly. We are working on assessing costs of the damage done to our roading network. Damage comes on top of damage already caused by Cyclone Gabrielle where we are informed there are 45 dropouts on rural roads that need to be repaired. The process for these things is one of an agreed budget with Waka Kotahi and also discussions with roading contractors as to literally who is available to do this work. With the amount of damage in the North Island over recent times, all of the contractors are incredibly busy so it may well be a case of waiting for our turn.



Last week we welcomed four new citizens to the Rangitikei district. They featured people from Samoa, Ireland and India.

We originally had a larger group apply but because of illness or commitments elsewhere they were not all able to attend this time. One of the nice things about having a smaller ceremony is that you actually get time to spend with the people and understand why they've come to New Zealand and what they're currently doing - and just being able to personally welcome them here.

Rangitikei District Council Chief Executive returns to Christchurch

Chief Executive Peter Beggs has tendered his resignation and will be leaving Council on 18 August 2023. Beggs, who has been in the role since 2019, is returning to Christchurch to take up a Chief Executive position with Apollo Projects.

Mayor Andy says that while Council is sad to see Peter go, they understand the motivation to grow his career and to be closer to his family and has accepted his resignation on that basis. "Peter has achieved a lot during his time with us and is regarded as having made significant progress in Council Health and Safety and Staff culture. Peter has been a key advocate for Rangitikei when it came to the Three Waters Reform and established a Project Management Office to manage key Council projects. We wish him well in his new role, and thank him for his service to our community"

Beggs says that his time being part of the Rangitikei District Council has been an honour.

"I have truly loved working for Council, and I am very proud of the huge improvements we have made for the benefit of our community, and the work of my colleagues and staff."

Taihape Community Board

What do we do. When do we meet.

Who are we. How to become involved.

We represent the people of the Northern Ward from Ohingaiti to Moawhango and Pukeokahu Junction. We are your voice to the Rangitikei District Council. We make submissions to the council's annual plans and policy proposals. The council looks for the board's views on issues that affect Taihape.

We hold bi-monthly meetings on the second Wednesday of the month at Kokako St Hall at which the public are welcome. Individuals and organizations can make submissions, ask for our assistance and air their views. Already this year we have had submissions from groups regarding housing in Taihape and the preservation of town hall and the need for local involvement in this.

Every other month we hold workshops to plan informally explore actions that we can do on behalf of the community.

The board comprises four elected members: Peter Kipling-Arthur, Emma Abernethy, Gail Larson and Les Clarke plus the Ward councillors, Gill Duncan and Jeff Wong.

If you have questions, ideas, or problems with the Rangitikei District Council the members of the Taihape Community Board are here to listen, support and guide you through the process of interaction with the council.

In the last month we have submitted to the council on the annual and spatial plans; especially emphasizing the desire of the wider community for a Civic Centre in the current Town Hall complex plus the needs of Mangaweka for some safer pedestrian crossings [this also has implications for Taihape]. Contact has been made with people in Ohingaiti regarding their concerns over some aspects of their roadside presentation.

If the community has concerns or suggestions for the Taihape Community Board, please contact members or write to us, care of the RDC offices. A written or emailed communication is always welcome and will guarantee a response.

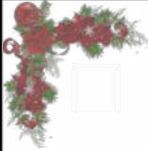

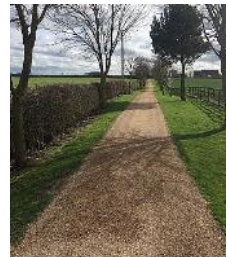
