What is Matariki?


Mānawa maiea te putanga o Matariki Mānawa maiea te ariki o te rangi Mānawa maiea te mātahi o te tau

Council News



FROM THE Mayor'S DESK

Kia ora koutou, over the last few weeks I have received many requests from the rural community to look at roading damage and the concerns of the impacts of forestry. I have arranged a field trip for councillors and staff in the next fortnight to start a conversation around preventative maintenance and the funding pressures Waka Kotahi is faced with. The common thread of these conversations has been around Cyclone

Gabrielle, forestry slash and the knowledge that we are and will be faced with these issues.

The 2023/24 Annual Plan was adopted last month by Council with some changes to the draft plan we consulted on. The earthquake strengthening and bringing the Taihape administration centre up to code has had the tick to go ahead while the Marton build has been pushed to a discussion in next year's Long Term Plan (LTP) to allow for a better understanding of our debt position and staffing needs. The Council have approved the Ngā Tawa walkway which was already in our projected budgets. This will result in a slight increase in the budget figures. Already we know that we will be facing some identified extra costs for next year from things such as roading, insurance costs and for the recruitment process for the replacement of our Chief Executive Peter Beggs following his resignation.

My congratulations go to the many community groups working in our parks, reserves, heritage organisations and the volunteers working in our rural fire crews for your relentless work throughout our region – your community spirit makes this place home and the district is richer because of you.

Donation made to Tararua District Council

Rangitīkei Mayor Andy Watson popped into the Tararua District Council's meeting last month to hand over a symbolic cheque as our district's contribution to help cyclone recovery. Mayor Andy handed over a cheque for \$20,000 adding that it was "a mere drop in the bucket". "Having been through these sorts of events, it's important that the local government family bind together." Tararua Mayor Tracey Collis says the Rangitīkei District is "very close to ours. It's got the same rural identity, the same large roading network. She says both districts have a great deal in common, with a smaller ratepayer base. We understand the sacrifice your people have made when we needed it most."

TAIHAPE COMMMUNITY BOARD UPDATE JULY

Last month we posted an article summarizing what we do and how we relate to both the community and council. This month's article is a summary of what we are working on going forward.

At our June meeting, we were pleased to hear Gina Parkes speaking on the need of the village of Ohingaiti for some assistance with the beautification of the village. The Taihape Community Board suggested that a local committee draw up plans and seek information from the Council about land that can be used. We are happy to assist them with funding and await their reporting back in August.

The District Council informed us that they are commencing maintenance on the Tui Street facilities.

The Community Board has commenced work on the following items:

- New plantings have been placed in the three planter boxes on the corner by Quickstop.
- The sensor pads in the three defibrillators in Taihape have been upgraded.
 These lifesaving devices are at New World, the Library, and the Swimming Pool.
- Installation of a concrete pad for the picnic table at the Dog Park plus possibly a few benches for dog owners.
- Repainting of the Photo Board at the Outback. If you are interested in helping and extend your artistic skills, drop a name in to the library or to Gail Larsen.
- The museum has been contacted to assist with research so we can add more historic photographs of the Railway to the display up at the Outback and along to the Coffee HQ.
- The Community Board is researching a soft impact product to install at the foot of the Gumboot Statue.
- The Council has offered the Community Board use of the former croquet club shelters, for refurbishment and placing elsewhere in the town. If you have ideas, please contact Peter Kipling-Arthur.

This month our workshop is going to be on two topics. Use of the Events Boards at the entrances to Taihape and the issues of traffic safety in Mangaweka and Taihape.

Gardening in Taihape

Its been a funny old season in the garden. Not much sun in the summer or in the autumn, either. Now well in to winter with the shortest day coming, we suddenly get a string of fine days and with it the first real frosts. The last outdoor tomatoes have finally been picked and the nasturtiums have called it a day. Its time to store the pumpkins.

Strangely with a summer like we have had a good crop of pumpkins has been harvested making good presents for friends and those in need.

Jobs on hand. In my garden the big clean up has begun leaving seed heads for ornament and the birds to enjoy till the last. Planting of vegetables should be well on the way, a good dose of compost will help.

If you grow winter roses, hellebores, its a good idea to cut all the leaves off, doing way with old, perhaps diseased leaves and allowing flowers to show off - some are in bloom already.

Of course a rainy rather dull season has made lawn mowing a regular job for some and the growth of shrubs and perennials has been almost too much. Most gardens now needs a firm hand; have a good look and remove anything that's not up to scratch. For those with small sections without wheel y bins, the removal of garden litter can be difficult. Its an easy matter to 'hide' soft matter however - if its out of sight, does it matter?

Any twigs and smaller branches can be cut up and spread around soon to decompose. Lawn clippings. Spread thinly as a light mulch they are good - too heavy a hand, no.
