FROM THE Mayor's Desk

Kia ora koutou, it feels as though every Council report includes mention from me about Three Waters and the water entities. Government has now settled on10 entities rather than four as the option and invited public and Council submissions. I submitted on behalf of Council and used the time to argue for the removal of the rural water schemes from their transition to the entity and questioned Government on detail, particularly



how true regional representation will be facilitated. The reality is that Government is moving at a 'break-neck' pace to have the legislation in place before the house rises for the general election. We are truly on a set course dictated by Government.

On 24 July a presentation was held at Te Matapihi from The Office for Māori Crown Relations – Te Arawhiti. The meeting discussed the Mokai Patea treaty settlement negotiations. Mokai Patea are a grouping of four iwi – Ngāti Te Ohuake, Ngāti Hauiti, Ngāti Tamakōpiri and Ngāti Whitikaupeka. Council and I will be particularly interested in the recognition of land locked lands and how they are to be accessed as for many, many years iwi have been denied any resolution on these matters. How iwi and Council work together and recognise the injustices of the past to forge future relationships is incredibly important.


Peter Beggs (Chief Executive), Arno Benadie (Chief Operating Officer) and I met with a local contractor from Hunterville who has come up with some refinement/cost saving measures to cope with low value roading maintenance and repair on our minor rural roads. It is easy to say that there are difficulties with process and there are, but we need to find solutions. If there can be more empowerment given to local input, a greater working relationship with local farmers including the establishment of more local approved dump sites, we should at least look at these options ahead of our roading procurement. We will not get a better chance.

Finally, I attended the powhiri for the Spanish Women's Football Team in Palmerston North on 17 July. The FIFA Women's World Cup is a major world event and I hope that we as New Zealanders attend in numbers, enjoy the spectacle and support this fabulous event.

In the June issue of TUT we talked about the role of the Taihape Community Board in general. This time the focus is on how we can help the people of the Northern Ward access the Board, the Rangitikei District Council and related services. There are two main methods

REQUEST FOR SERVICE

If you want to fix, solve or repair an issue that you believe the council can help with please use a Request for Service. The Request For Service [RFS] <u>Report it -</u> <u>Request for Service: Rangitikei District Council</u> is available on the Rangitikei District Councils Website. If you fill this in and provide as much information as possible and even a photographic image. This will enable the council to respond and keep you informed of how the issue is being resolved.

If you do not have access to a computer and email, you can always lodge RFS by going to the library and council offices in Hautapu St and lodge it in person. The office staff are friendly and skilled in assisting people to complete their requests. All requests will be responded to within 48 Hours and information regarding a solution will be given as soon as possible. Once you lodge a request, if you don't hear back, please don't hesitate to ask your local councillors for assistance in following up on your concern.

PUBLIC FORUM

At each board meeting there is a space for a public forum. This is where you, the public, can speak to us about a concern or project that you would like us to address or consider. So far this year we have had speakers from the Housing Group, concerned Ohingaiti Residents amongst others plus written requests from Taihape Neighbourhood Support, Taihape Museum and Historical Society. The advantage of a public forum is that it allows the board to explore with the speakers or groups what the needs are. It allows all of the board to be involved not just the one member that may have been approached initially.

The Taihape Community Board welcomes people to the Public Forum. Do not hesitate to contact a board member and put ideas forward.

Fatigue -Do you have it?

Feeling exhausted and rundown?

Sleep Hygiene

- · Limit caffeine after lunchtime
- Increase your daily activity/exercise, once fatigue has passed
- Create a bedtime ritual Do a 10-minute calming breath, where your exhale is twice the length of your inhale
- · Limit screen time before bed
- Try to go to bed by/before 10 pm
- Take magnesium or sleep-supporting herbs if you have a hard time going to sleep or staying asleep
- Do Yoga "Sun Salutation a few rounds before bed. This drops our cortisol levels making it easier to go to sleep and to have a more restful sleep

Gardening in Taihape

Our monthly meeting on August 3rd was our highly anticipated annual plant auction. This is a good time when choice plants are offered and shared - the bidding can be quite spirited. Takings on the night go into the bank making possible future trips away.

On the garden front its a time for cleaning up and composting leaves and soft garden clippings. Its also time to organize and rearrange. Pruning of roses is certainly timely; August is the best time, any later, growth will have started. Its a matter of opinion how hard to do this but always cutting slantwise just above a node. Most people tip prune just cutting off top growth. This is quite effective though hard pruning results in better growth and renews older bushes. The roses at the southern entrance to town have already been attended to and are worth looking at if in doubt.

Many garden shrubs can be pruned too but hydrangeas are commonly mistreated. Just prune off any old flowering heads and thin out weak old stems. The shoots with terminal buds are next years flowers so leave them alone. Smoke bushes, belonging to the cotinus family, respond to hard pruning almost to waste height. (Cotinus 'Grace' is commonly seen, perhaps the most beautiful.) Bigger shrubs or trees like Gleditsia, or 'Honey locust' and golden elms though not really for small town gardens can receive the same treatment. No coat hangers please.

Brook O'Donnell has left us and settled into his new job in Hawkes Bay. Its a large firm; he works along side four other landscape architects. From time to time he expects to return to Taihape. We look forward to that and wish him well.


