The upgrade has provided four changing rooms, each with toilets and showers, two smaller multi-purpose rooms, extra referee rooms, and a small commentators/observation room. The building will be fully accessible, there will be three public toilets, two of which include showers and a car park.

FROM THE Mayor'S DESK

Kia ora koutou, on 18 August our outgoing Chief Executive Peter Beggs left to take up his new position in Christchurch, Kevin Ross the Council appointment Interim Chief Executive took up the role on the following day. Thank you to Kevin for stepping in, it certainly makes things easy when you seem to know most of our locals, iwi and neighbouring Chief Executives.

Applications close this week to select the new Chief Executive and I have been advised by Jackson Stone the recruitment agency that there has been significant interest in the position.

With the upcoming national elections in less than eight weeks each political party has been parading their policies and initiatives, although it is cynical to say so there is an element of vote catching rather than attempts to deal with issues. On the 23 August, I travelled to Parliament to hear Ian McKelvie one of our MP's giving his valedictory speech as a retiring MP before the House rises. lan's service to Local Government and then to the country has been incredibly impressive, he was the Mayor of the Manawatū District from 2002 to 2011 and then he was elected to be the National Representative for the Rangitikei from 2011 to now. We acknowledge the 21 years of service and wish him well - knowing lan it is unlikely to be a total retirement.

Government has now enacted or made into law the Three Waters legislation. The revised legislation has "stood up" 10 different water entities of which we are in Entity E made up of the Horizons Regional authorities. Who knows what will happen following the election? If National wins or forms Government in a negotiated partnership they have said that they will repeal and replace however as we don't know quite what that means all I can say is that interesting and challenging times lie ahead of us. Putting together our Council Long Term Plan in this uncertainty will be difficult.

The Board's workshop this month is looking at the long term vision the Board has for the northern Rangitikei

It's great to see that the new St Johns Ambulance base is closer to being ready. We can help make the ambulance staff's work easier by making sure all houses in Taihape and district have clear numbers. As St John says "When you call 111, you want the ambulance, fire service or police to be able to find you as quickly as possible. Without clear numbering at the front of your property, this becomes difficult and wastes precious time, especially in the dark. So being able to quickly and clearly see your property number, at any time of the day or night, is really important."

Your local Hato Hone St John Taihape Area Committee has initiated the 'Safety in Numbers' project to install better property numbering where required, to help make it easier for emergency services to quickly find the correct location. If you know of a property in Taihape that would benefit from clearer numbering, please let St John know so they can help.

Please remember that as the general election nears, and we are inundated with colourful billboards, we all should get out and vote. Voting means our voices are heard even in a small way, democracy is for all of us.

The RDC has been very proactive in notifying Waka Kotahi/ Land Transport NZ of our concerns over the slumping in in SH1 at Utiku. Our thanks to Mayor and Councillors for working with us on this.

Rangitikei Guardians Inc

The recent Rangitikei Guardians (RGs), Annual and General Meetings were held on the 19th July and established that their stance, with regard to Meridian Energy Ltd's, now discontinued, Project Central Wind, is still valid. This includes that the RGs:

- Are not against renewable energy projects, and especially wind technology;
- Consider that all renewable energy projects, including Wind farms, should be evaluated on the same lines as "right tree, in the right place";
- Reiterate that Project Central Wind was in the wrong place. Manawa Energy, (Previously Trust Power), is currently looking to resurrect Meridian's discontinued Wind farm project on the same footprint.

The RGs confirm that they are opposed to this project but are looking for community input to gauge opinion. Please have your say by going to the Rangitikei Guardians Inc Facebook page. The Importance of Breathing Correctly

Breathing is one of the most immediate, basic necessities in life. If you are of good health, you can probably go for about six weeks without food and a few days without water. Without breathing, you will not survive more than a few minutes. We draw our first breath a moment after we were born and one day we will expire with our very last exhalation. In between this time, our breath is our constant companion. Our breath is nearer to us than anything else in life, and dearer to us than our wealth and the people we love the most. If we lose our breath, we lose everything. And yet, most people probably rarely, if ever, think about how, or even why, we breathe. Although no one can survive without breathing, many of us manage to live a good portion of our lives without breathing properly. The stressful pace of this fast-changing modern life together with sedentary jobs and leisure pursuits, contribute to unhealthy breathing habits by creating tension in our body that inhibits the full expansion of our chest. Poor respiratory habits can take a very heavy toll on our physical, mental and emotional health as well as on our happiness. Shallow breathing can also contributes to many chronic stress-

related health conditions.

We need to breathe out properly before we can fully breathe in. That is also one of the reasons why nature forces us to deflate our lungs by yawning or sighing when we are exhausted or bored - to force us to bring in fresh oxygen and revitalizing energy.

Carefully controlling our own breath helps us to lead a fuller life by ridding our body of waste products and maximizing oxygen intake. It also relieves the symptoms of anxiety - such as a furrowed brow, tight shoulders and stomach cramps and can calm our busy mind and improve our mood. As we practice the breathing exercises in a proper way, we will notice that we think more clearly, act with greater determination and confidence and are less carried away by our emotions.



Gardening in Taihape

Our September meeting will be well attended. Our guest speaker is hellebore specialist Ken Telford, who is traveling up from his home near Gore bringing double flowered hellebores for us to enjoy. Ken's wife, Kate, pollinates each plant by hand so each is unique; probably the Telfords are the only people in the country carrying out this extensive breeding programme.

Most hellebores available for sale these days are propagated by 'tissue culture' producing hundreds, in fact thousands of identical plants. Many of these are outstanding but are usually cultured over seas.

After dull winter days many plants will start to enjoy spring. Camellias are wonderful shrubs and there are small growing varieties available.

Camellias with smaller leaves (C.sasanqua) are less liable to petal blight which disfigures the larger leaved (C. japonica,) varieties. Of these varieties 'Fairy Blush' is currently the most favoured and highly recommended; in Taihape it starts to flower in mid winter. Despite frosts it continues to open its small blush pink flowers for months.

Enjoying popularity world wide, this camellia was bred by Mark Jury in Taranaki. Turning to rhododendrons many gardens have pink flowered 'Christmas Cheer' in bloom, even in winter. If you prefer red as a colour, our own "R.'Rubicon' is another New Zealand bred plant enjoyed overseas; bred in fact by the late Ron Gordon, one of our long standing garden club members. With bright red trusses of flowers carried over glossy green leaves, it is a winner. A spring shrub not seen so much these days is forsythia, again there are several varieties. It flowers with a burst of bright yellow flowers on a deciduous medium sized bush.

A big advantage of forsythia is that it is easily grown from hard wood cuttings.

The September issue of the New Zealand GARDENER featured the garden of our own Brook O'Donnell. Well done Brook.


