FROM THE Mayor'S DESK

Kia ora koutou, the Daybreaker Rally kicked off in Feilding on 22 September. Manawatū Mayor Helen and myself were given the incredibly important tasks of flagging the cars on their way. I was stunned at the number of spectators who came to watch the ceremonial start. People queued for the best part of one and a half hours to get the signatures of drivers like Hayden Paddon



and Shane van Gisbergen. The public interest in rallying and motorsport was amazing. The rally travelled over both Manawatū and Rangitīkei roads and we are often told they are the best and most challenging rallying roads in New Zealand. The following day between 8am and midday the rally arrived in Taihape where all the cars stopped for a service session - this gave everybody the chance to have a look at the machinery and especially the scale of the work teams and pit crew have to put in. Of the 92 cars that had entered most of them had got to Taihape with only a few withdrawals. The great thing was that the rally coincided with the Spring Fling in Taihape where there were numerous stalls, displays and activities on the main streets and around the town. Spring Fling is organised annually by the Taihape Community Development Trust and is a tremendous showcase of talent and entertainment and I thank Pania and her team for making it possible. For me it was the chance to grab a hot pie, something to drink and to wander the streets talking to people and spending time looking at the rally cars.

I am writing this on the 2nd of October, the day that voting opens for the general elections. I have been to a couple of Meet the Candidates nights, listened to numerous debates and read the huge number of promises that every political party has made. Whether they will all be honoured in the outcome of the election is a moot point, however promises have been made and we can hold whoever gets into power to account. I would encourage everybody to go and vote – it is no point complaining if you don't have a say!





Gardening in Taihape

Our September meeting was a sell-out. Visitors came from afar - Raetihi, Ohakune and Hunterville, lured by the guest speaker. Ken Telford came from the deep south with generously donated boxes of his hellebore plants, each doubled in flower. These were all two years in the growing, each meticulously hand pollinated, very special and not often for sale up our way. Over fifty keen customers soon made short work of them and filled our coffers.

Spring is here but taking its time with frequent dull wet days. Daylight saving gives that extra hour for the garden. Weeds can be a problem if they have caught up with you. Spraying may be needed but leave to dry for at least two hours afterwards to get a good kill; be mindful though of the birds, bees and insects.

Spring is awash with pink flowers. Flowering now in the Triangle in town there are big specimens of the cherry Prunus yedoensis. Up on Dixon Way there is wonderful plant in full bloom of Magnolia stellata 'Rosea.' This was planted years ago by Barbara Peed, a long time Garden Club member. Magnolias make a great garden plant and there are many to choose from. There are a number around town. If you have a small garden Magnolia 'Genii' is highly recommended - not only is it small it flowers prolifically at a young age. A larger choice would be M. campbelli or its many hybrids - for example 'Strawberry Fields.' A good thing to know is that Magnolias need shelter but are easily moved just after flowering.

Colour is always the thing most people like to see. A few punnets of annuals wont go amiss so get a few and poke them in in any vacant spot. Even in this dull weather it will be surprising how soon you will get some flowering. Pansies and violas are a stand-by with their their wide eyes; left to them selves they seed and will reward again next year. It's too soon to be thinking about tender plants for the vegetable garden. But as soon as corn, pumpkins and tomatoes are in the shops don't be tempted too soon - it may be too early for these main stays in Taihape? With shelter and care it will soon be time.


