## FROM THE Mayor'S

Kia ora koutou, last month saw the running of the 25th anniversary of the Shemozzle. The beauty of the event is that I can use the name "Shemozzle" and virtually everybody in the Rangitīkei would know what I'm talking about. I have never seen so many people at the Shemozzle or any other event at the same time in the number of years I've been involved. The turnout was well into the thousands of people with, I think, in excess of 650 competitors spread across the various age groups and the shepherds Shemozzle race. It was a real thrill to be there, the weather was stunning and I got to talk to so many people from outside of the district who had travelled to this event because they'd heard about it on the national grapevine. The committee that organised it absolutely deserves full credit - it is professionally run and they had the resources to deal with any event that played out during the day.

Recently, there has been a lot of local talk around the speed and road restrictions on State Highway 1 just south of Utiku. The slumping of the road is certainly not a new event, it has been ongoing for decades. What is new is the increasing risk of a major earth movement which could cut State Highway 1 and the main trunk rail line off for an extended period. Waka Kotahi are under urgency working on the business case for both reforming and/or replacement of the section of road and a "Plan B" in case of failure. Our concern is that if there was to be a major closure of State Highway 1 that our roading network would not support a diversion locally and any diversion would probably need to be State Highways 3, 4 or potentially State Highway 2.

There has also been a lot of discussion in Taihape around the rebuild of the Taihape Area School. It is in the public arena that the Ministry of Education and School Board have asked Council if we



can work with them to provide a site for the temporary relocation of the school for a period of what could well be a couple of years. It is important to note that this request has been driven by the Ministry and Board and at the moment we are not in the position to engage with the user groups of the park for instance, however we will not make any decisions without consultation with the community user groups. Our principal driver is to support education in Taihape – we intend to do all we can to make sure that the rebuild of the school is on track and that the school community is supported in any way we can.

Increasingly, I as Mayor have been asked to spend time in Wellington as part of a small select group of Mayors to sit on roading, the Future of Local Government and an interface with the new Government. While unfortunately it takes time away from some of the local Council issues it is incredibly important and certainly increases our chance of assistance from the Government, National Council's most recent meeting recommended providing regular formal updates from LGNZ to member councils. I will be providing fourmonthly reports to Council on these matters. These reports provide progress updates on strategic goals and are designed to help ensure all Elected Members are across LGNZ's work and able to give feedback.



#### Gardening in Taihape

Members at our October meeting were treated to another interesting talk by an out- of- town grower. On this occasion this was Wendy Begbie who runs a nursery specializing in Irises at Katikati. We were treated to a slide show and marveled at the number of these lovely flowers; we also learnt a lot about growing them. Continuing an interesting programme this month, we will have Matthews Roses, from Fordell; who will show us many of their new hybrid roses that they are releasing this season.

Spring was certainly a mixed bag for us resulting in a late garden. To cap it off there were a couple of heavy frosts which played havoc with early plants. Surprisingly, residents of nearby Mangaweka have a slightly milder climate and one garden at least, grows a number of citrus and other desirable s. But double flowered pink cherries are just past their peak to be continued by flowering apples, malus, and a host of others. Here in Taihape the Taiwan cherry, Prunus campanulata is the first to flower. Its masses of carmine red flowers are heaven to tuis and other honey hungry birds; this results in many seedlings popping up in our gardens. Up north in Kerikeri, this cherry is so successful it has become a weed.

Labour weekend, just past, seems to be the traditional time to plant vegetable gardens. A tempting array is now available in the shops pumpkins, marrows, tomatoes and corn to name a few. Buy them now but keep them somewhere close by before planting out, sheltered from any cold weather still to come. Seedlings in the shops will have come from warmer climates and will not be acclimatized. Growing your pumpkins and the like from your own saved seed is rewarding and a fun thing to do but remember they will not come true to the parent. The bees will have been busy.

Annual weeds are happy. Taihape is home to many perennial weeds also. Convolvulus is one of the hardest to get rid of and pulling has little effect. Another commonly seen in gardens is a dead nettle-(Lamium galeobdolon.) It is said this makes a lovely ground-cover. Be warned, left to its own devices, its a thug, a dreadfully invasive weed and can cover a hectare in twenty years. Get rid of it now if you plan to live that long. We wont mention 'old mans beard' but pull it out if it pops up in your garden; it does just that, regularly in mine.
