Taihape Projects Update





Papakai Wastewater project update

Since 2020, Council has been investing in upgrades to the pump station. An upgraded pump station is now operational, which gives the overall wastewater system more capability. We are nearing the completion of the next stage in the project, which will lead to significant environmental improvements.

Taihape residents will know that there has been quite a bit of construction activity happening at the park for the past few months, and we know that it's caused some inconvenience for users of this space. But it's with good reason. The current wastewater system in Taihape is not fit for purpose. There are well documented issues with the pump station at Papakai, which has lead to sewage discharges into the Hautapu River.

Two fibreglass wastewater storage tanks have been installed at the park to reduce the chance of sewage overflows into the river during heavy rain events. The tanks are both 28m in length, and together can store up to 260,000 litres of wastewater, which then gets treated.

Speaking of treatment, many questions have been asked about treated wastewater being discharged to land rather than into the river as it does currently. The amount of land needed for such an operation is significant. Initial calculations suggest that depending on the soil type and other factors, 170-630 hectares would be needed, and it has to be flat land without runoff into any waterways. There is not a lot of land around Taihape. While we continue to look into the best practical option for the long term future we are also looking into ways to upgrade our treatment plant to achieve a better quality of the discharge.

This will see wastewater treated to a better level before returning to the river systems. While it won't completely remove all the discharge, it will be an improvement on what currently goes into the river.

Council staff will be meeting with locals in the next month to discuss the restoration of Papakai Park to its recreation use, as part of our Making Good strategy.

Taihape Community Board

As we reach the end of the first year of the term as a community board there is time to reflect and to look forward to the next twelve months.

The first three months were heavily involved with visiting the district and covering the whole Northern Ward and listening to the needs of the smaller Communities. Once the LTP and Annual Plan were out for discussion; the Board was part of the strong emphasis from the community to have the Council preserve the Civic Centre on the current site of the town hall complex. The turnout of the community organisations to the RDC engagement process on the Town Hall was fantastic. While not all items on the wider wish list will be undertaken at least we know that the Town Hall/Civic Centre will be preserved and improved.

This year also saw a wider number of submissions to the Public Forum of the Community Board. It was great to again to see the smaller communities seeking support or funding from the TCB. In 2024 the Community Board will be taking its workshops and perhaps one standing meeting out to those smaller communities, to recognize that the TCB represents all the Northern Ward of the Rangitikei District Council.

In the light of this, the Board this year has reviewed the legal role it has been given under the Local Government Act 2002. The delegated responsibilities and authorities were reviewed and those that were outdated have been removed. We are considering name change at the next representational review to reflect that as a Community Board we represent communities from Ohingaiti to Moawhango, Mataroa and others.

The Board has submitted to the RDC on road safety in the region. This was well received, and we are awaiting feedback from both RDC and the government agencies as to what is feasible

Some small projects have been completed, including the repainting of the Photo Board at the Outback. Others are awaiting completion in 2024.

The use of the Rangitikei District Council's RFS system for notification of concerns etc, is continued to be recommended as the best means of bringing people's concerns to the attention of the RDC staff. The regular articles in TUT have also provided information on our role as a Community Board, who we are and how people can contact us with their concerns. This was aimed to encourage people within the district to approach members, to write to us and to take part in both public forums and workshops.

Working with the staff and trustees of the Taihape Community Development Trust in their efforts, has continued and it has been enjoyable building a relationship with them.

Many thanks to the efforts of the Board Members and the Northern Ward Councillors.

Gardening in Taihape

Members had another treat at our November meeting where Samantha Matthews from Fordell was the guest speaker. Samantha talked and showed wonderful slides of roses and in particular the new varieties coming on the market from her family firm, Matthews Roses. 'Chawton Cottage,' a white climber with a dark eye was an eye stopper. So too were 'Bright Eyes' and 'Cappucino' - if you missed this meeting ask Mr Google to help. Matthews Roses is a family business with a show garden on S H 5 between Turakina and Whanganui. It's well worth a stop.

It's almost Summer time as this goes to print and it seems we are in for a hot summer. Spring has been a bit disappointing with some deciduous trees failing to come in to full leaf but weeds enjoying the conditions never the less. Perhaps this reflect the dull spring weather.

Rhododendrons and lilacs have put on a good show. In some local gardens an annual, 'Corn Cockle' has continued to brighten the days with its dazzling yellow daisies. It an annual and so easy to grow. Get some seed, there's plenty to share. Its been in full bloom for yonks.

But now its rose time. The triangle roe garden at the southern end of town is in full bloom. Notice how well they have been pruned to give a great display. So too the red carpet roses planted at the corner of the former Post Office; passing traffic gives them a quick go by due to their thorns - nearby tussock grasses are no deterrent due to their thorny nature. In the triangle flowering cherries put on a good show, spring past. As well, soon to flower are the rowan trees (Sorbus hupehensis). The flowers are nothing to write home about but wait for their autumn display when there are masses of china pink berries. Birds love them too.

Vegetable gardens will soon be full on. Baring a late frost pumpkins, cucumber, squash, and the like are enjoying the weather and now leaping away. Tomatoes too. Some more adventurous gardeners will be planting kumara. Again ask Mr Google for directions. There is no need to confine all these edibles to isolation in a garden on their own. Silver beet, lettuces and cabbages can be popped in any where there is a gap - the varieties with red leaves can make an early show and can end up on the pot if hunger demands and if need be. Corn too. This is a very ornamental plant, Try it!
