Taihape Projects Update

Taihape Town Hall

A project work plan was presented to Council on 14 Dec 2023 and was accepted.

As for the scope of the project, two major items were kept open for the final selected tenderer to decide. One was the option to either retain, or demolish & rebuild, the facade in a similar outlook. The other was the option to retain or remove the first-floor offices. Keeping costs to a minimum will be biggest driving factor for these two decisions.

A User Group has been established and the Project Management Office have been in touch with the group to keep them updated on any development.

The procurement process will be a two stage process with a Return of Investment (ROI) and



then a Request for Proposal (RFP). We anticipate the ROI to be posted online in mid-February. In order to provide the tenderers with a design direction, Council staff are engaging with a design consultant to prepare very high level concept sketches which will form part of the RFP documents.

The construction of the building was completed in August 2023 and Code Compliance Certificate is expected to be achieved in February 2024.

The building has been used since the construction was completed and very much enjoyed by the community.

In early 2024 the tennis/netball courts will also be painted in a grippy fresh colour.

The latest Chorus Cabinet Mural in the Rangitikei District, "Manus of the whenua", has been completed!

Located on the corner of Hautapu Street and Goldfinch Street in Taihape, here's the story behind the mural by artist TeAranga Haapu:

"I was born in Taihape and spent a lot of time here with my whanau, especially my Nan on Moa Street, as well as endless days on our marae (Opaea Marae) we would fondly call the Pa. I loved art during my school days and now as an adult I've decided to reconnect with my passion for creating. Painting this Chorus cabinet not only allows me to grow my novice skills as an artist, but also an opportunity to reconnect with my whānau."

"The birds reflect the surroundings street names but also the close ties to the whenua (land). Since the Moa and Huia are no longer with us,



they are behind the mist but the birds in the forefront are with us today especially in the surrounding area."

"The top and side panels are a pattern found inside the wharekai of Opaea Marae. I have painted this because my marae is on the same stretch of road and holds a special place in my heart."

Gardening in Taihape

It's the height of summer and our gardens are overflowing. (Don't mention the weeds - they have enjoyed the conditions as well!)- There are just so many shrubs and perennials in full bloom, right now.

Of shrubs hydrangeas are the stars of many gardens. They enjoy Taihape's soil and climate and are so useful filling up when the garden gets too large. Coming in a range of sizes, some are large and some tiny like H.

'Pia Maria.' These versatile shrubs are easy care and in colours ranging from white to red and blue to pink, depending on the soil. Hydrangea 'Annabelle' is a wonderful white mop-head enjoying some shade and needing pruning to head height in Winter. 'Limelight' is another very popular variety. Propagate from cuttings taken in late autumn early winter you will be surprised how easy this is. An added bonus; as soon as the flowers are mature they can be dried for indoor decoration, lasting indefinitely. Dahlias are a feature now and can be admired in many of our gardens. To begin the year our Club had an interesting talk from a lady who came to us from Eketahuna. This proved a good opportunity to learn more about these popular garden plants. A record number of members attended; the hall was packed. There was a wonderful display of dahlias on the the Bloom table. Large doubled flowers in a multitude of colours predominated. There

were few singles on display. though. Dr Keith Hammett, an internationally famous Auckland plant breeder has developed a range with single flowers; readily available in garden centers. Great plants too.

Beside being famous for Gumboots, Taihape is also well known for Clematis 'Old Man's Beard.' Coming in to flower right now it is easily identified. Its common all over the northern Rangitikei and presents an enormous problem. While biological control is being developed, we can all play our part by cutting it down in our own gardens and painting the stem with a woody weed killer. Not so well known is another dreadful weed; a perennial, lamiastrum. Its valued in many gardens as a ground cover. Eradicate it now. Left to itself it will cover several acres in twenty years. Left to itself it has done just that in a local property.


